

## The Venerable J. B. Marcellin Champagnat

On a delightful spring morning more than one hundred years ago a country priest wended his way up the slopes of the Jura Mountains to a small peasant farm. He had been called to administer the last sacraments to a boy who lay dying upon the poor couch of this humble home. As the priest set the holy oils on the table, he questioned the lad about religion. To his great surprise and chagrin, he found that the boy's ignorance of God would not permit him to receive the last rites without previous instruction. The shocked realization that a boy thirteen years of age, living in a Christian century and a Christian country knew nothing of God or the hereafter caused a profound impression on the saintly priest.

It was on this day as Venerable Marcellin Champagnat returned in deepest thought to his parish at Lavalla, that he determined to organize a teaching society of religious to bring the knowledge of God and the august Virgin Mary to youth.

From this tiny mustard seed sprang the Institute of Marist Brothers. Today that Institute numbers more than twelve thousand members and spreads its protecting arms over three hundred thousand students the world over.

Everywhere, in all their schools, the Brothers carry with them the spirit of their Founder, a spirit of humble, patient labor for boys to bring to them a knowledge of God and love for His Mother.

#### Leonel Pena



#### Football Notes




