
# *Foreword*

It is for this reason, to serve as a precious reminder of the carefree days of our youth, that this annual is published.


The years will come and go; but the precious memories, our teachers, classrooms, and classmates will remain forever in a tender niche close to our hearts.




Human Pyramid

## FOOTBALL NOTES

With only six returning lettermen to start, Coach Waydell Hunter prepared with his usual characteristic football enthusiasm to ready the boys for the season, and swept through the gridiron with flourishing success. September 8 gave Coach Hunter a chance to unveil his 1949 squad. It proved a very satisfactory one, as the Antlers decisively defeated an inexperienced San Diego eleven 59-0.

Eagle Pass provided the Antlers much stiffer opposition the following weekend and in a sea of mud, the much heavier Eagles edged out the Hilltoppers by a score of 12-7.

Monterrey Tech, a tough Antler rival, was next in tow; the score speaks for itself proving this clash a very tight one. Final figures on the green boards were 19 for the Antlers and 12 for the Borregos. La Joya and Robstown reserves fell easily before the Antler powerhouse as the Deermen had successive field days in these two games.

Gigantic St. Gerard's Royal Blue came down from the Alamo City to clash with the Antlers and after the game, they bid farewell to this border city with a 23-7 victory. On October 27, the Maroons traveled 200 miles west-bound to Del Rio only to receive a 33-13 reverse at the hands of Regional Champ, San Felipe.

November 11 was the most important day of the season for the Antlers. Clash-ing with their main rivals, the Bloodhounds of Brownsville, the Huntermen fought dauntlessly against great odds and won the most sought-after game of the season 19-6.


Cotulla was the last team to beat the Antlers during the regular campaign. The Cowboys drubbed the injury-ridden Maroons who played without the services of two starters. It was a fierce game marked by daring blocking and tackling, but as the game advanced, the absence of the two starters took the Antlers' toll and they had to settle with a 27-13 setback.

The Mirando City Panthers, a surprisingly improved team, were the next vic-tims of the Maroon-clad legions as the Antlers overcame a 12-6 deficit at halftime and edged the Panthers 13-12 in a dust-clouded field.

The '49 football season reached its climax on November 23 when the Antlers played and almost beat a highly favored Victoria Flyer team. With only two minutes to go and the Antlers ahead 6-0, Victoria's desperate passing attack finally netted a touchdown to tie up the game. It was a moral victory for the Antlers, however, as they had led throughout the game and it was the closest a St. Joseph's team has ever come to beating Victoria.




