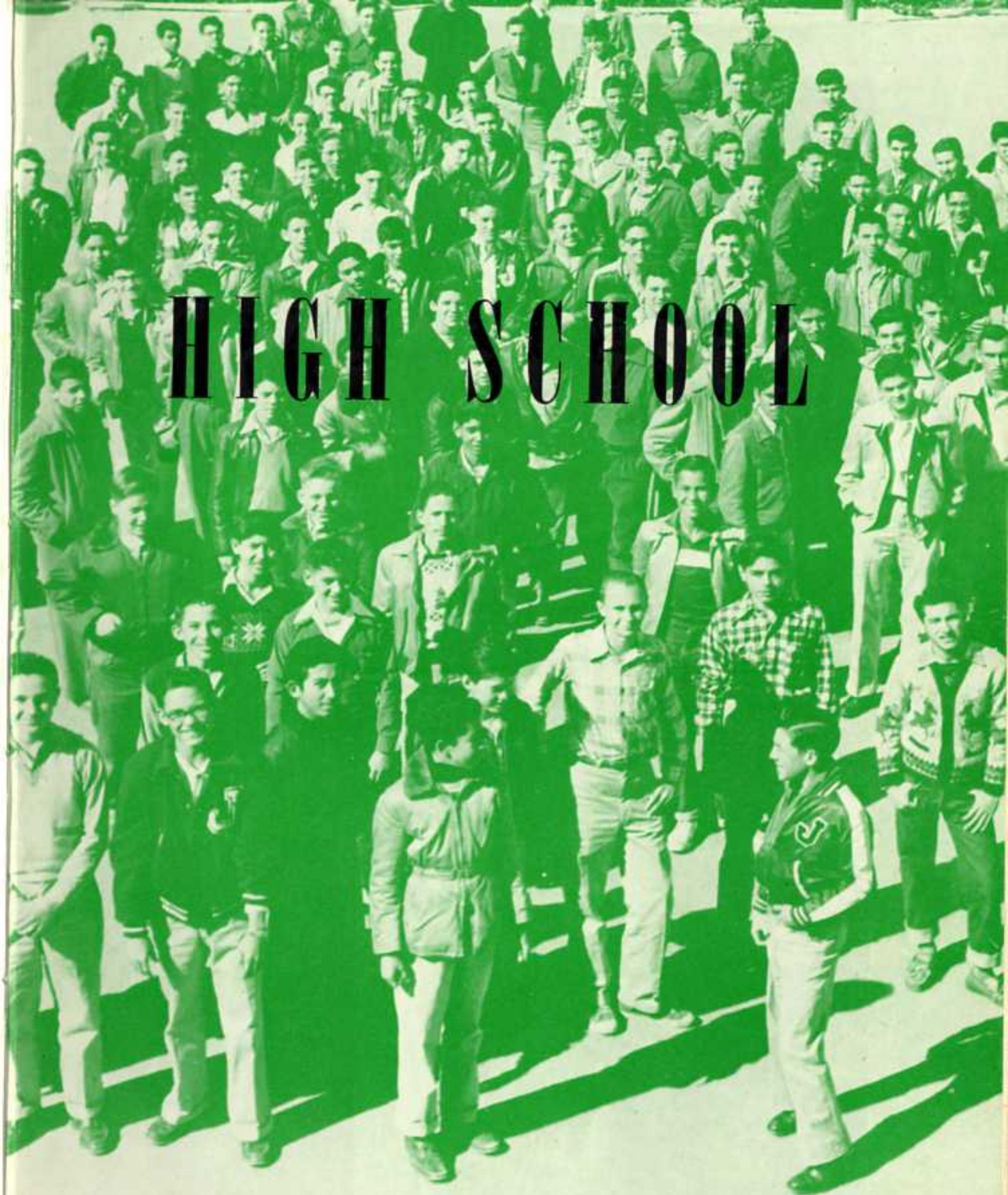
Foreword . . .
