





FIFTY YEARS DEDICATED TO THE SERVICE OF GOD





Brother Henry B. Fumeaux, F.M.S.

In Conthey, which is located in the heart of the Pennine Alps in Switzerland, Bro. Henry was born on July 22, 1887. Hearing the voice of the Master calling him to the religious life, Bro. Henry left his native land on June 1, 1900 to enter the Marist Juniorate of Serres in France. After a three-year period of religious training, he received the livery of Mary—the religious cassock—in the Novitiate of St. Paul-Trois-Chateaux, Drone, France.

Great was the upheaval in France during the year 1903, when the French Premier Combes placed religious in the alternative of abandoning their religious habit or leaving their native land. Brother Henry followed courageously the example of many French Brothers that left France to come to the new world. Providence sent Bro. Henry to the neighboring Republic of Mexico, where he completed his religious and pedagogical training. He taught in the schools directed by the Marist Brothers in Irapuato, Guadalajara, and Monterrey from the years 1906-1914, when the revolutionary forces of Carranza obliged religious to leave Mexico.

Brother Henry received a hearty welcome to the United States from the Marist Brothers who had opened a school in Brownsville in 1906.

After a period of study in St. Mary's University of San Antonio, where Bro. Henry was the object of the fraternal and generous help of the Marianist Brothers, he was appointed by his Superiors to the new foundation of Tucson, Arizona, where he remained from 1914 to 1917. In 1917 Bro. Henry was named director of St. Joseph's Academy in Brownsville, Texas. Placing all his

confidence in the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, the young director began to work earnestly. When he took the direction of the school, there were only 58 pupils; soon the Academy had 125 students and the Superiors agreed to build a new school. At present, Brownsville counts over 550 students.

From 1917 to 1937, with only short absences, Bro. Henry remained in Brownsville either as local Superior or Vice-Principal. In August 1937 Bro. Henry came to Laredo to help in the foundation of St. Joseph's Academy, From 1942 to 1948 Bro. Henry was appointed Principal of the Academy in Laredo. During his six-year administration, the enrollment in the Academy increased, and numerous improvements were made in the school. At present Bro. Henry is Vice-Principal and teaches in the high school department; he also cultivates the numerous and varied plants which beautify the Academy. In every house where Brother Henry has been, plants seem to grow as if it were by magic when Brother Henry cultivates them. This enjoyable hobby has kept Brother Henry in good health and has given him many a happy hour of solar relaxation. In every bush, citrus fruit, vine, and rosebush the faithful gardener sees reflected the power and beauty of God.

INTEGRITY is the word which seems to summarize Brother Henry's character best; the "simplicity of heart and sincerity of God," are traits which depict Bro. Henry best. These great qualities have endeared him to his confreres, to his pupils, and to his numerous friends.

May God keep him for many years to come.







Time marches on. Repeatedly as before another year has elapsed and we, the Seniors, must take an important step in life as we regretfully leave our beloved Alma Mater.


Precisely for this reason we are proud to publish our school annual, the "Maroon and White".
