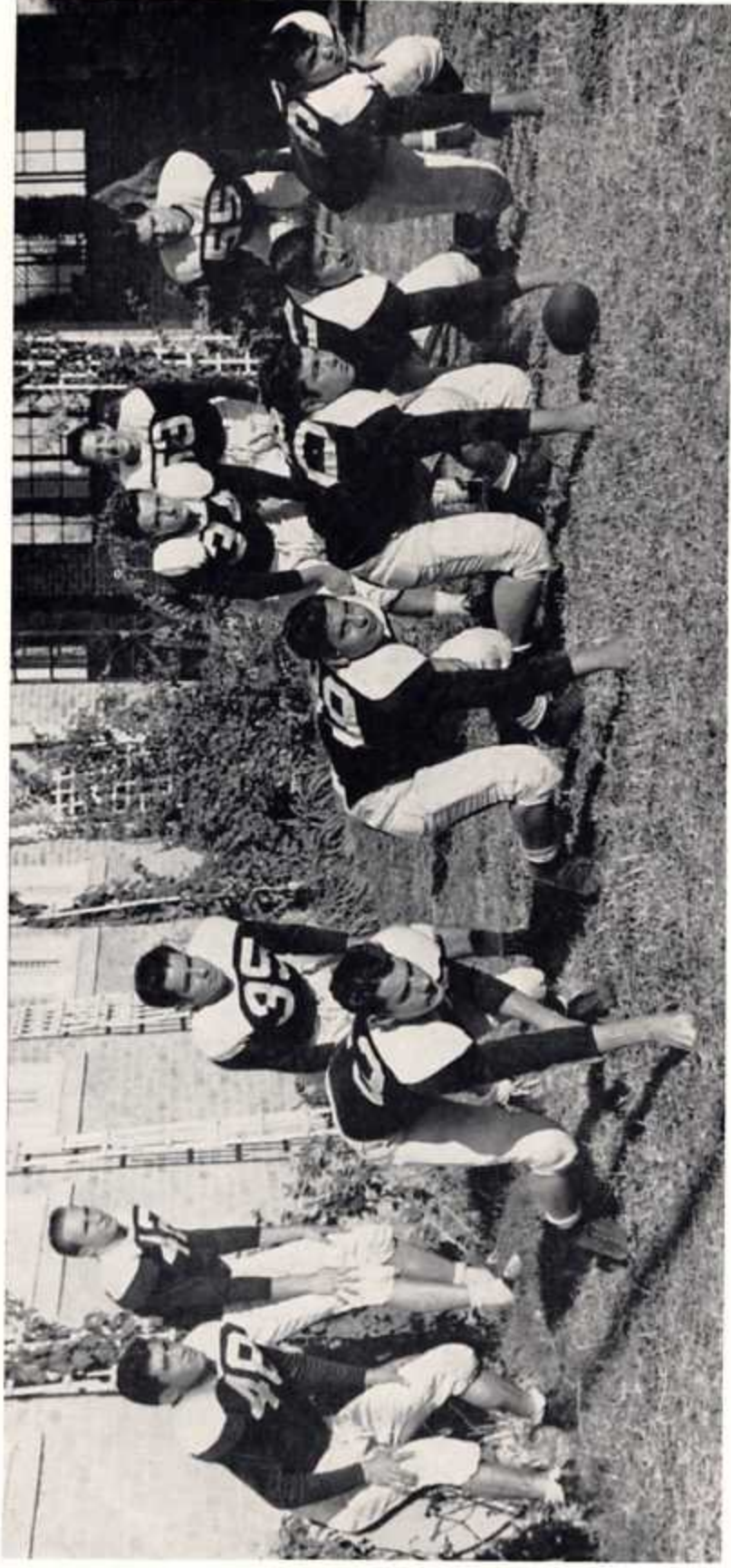
ANTLERS 19, BROWNSVILLE 0
