Indeed, the Sodality is and will be a challenge to all Academy students.



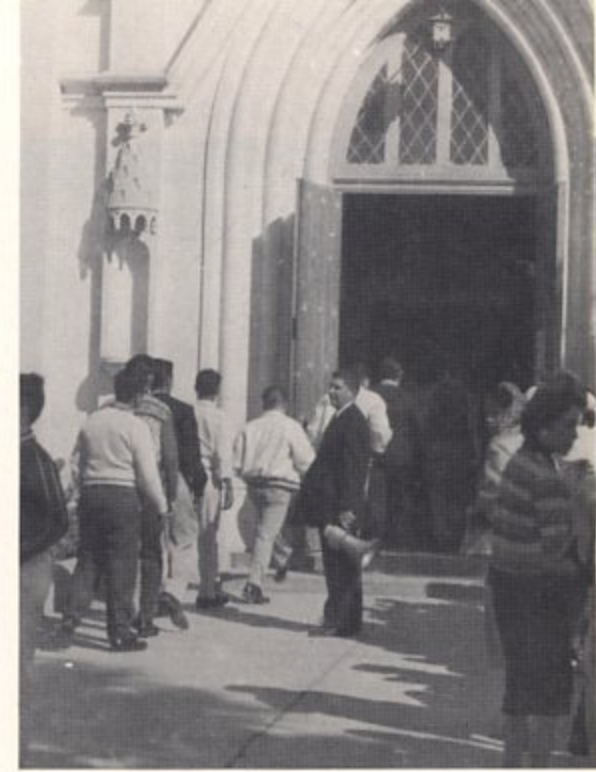

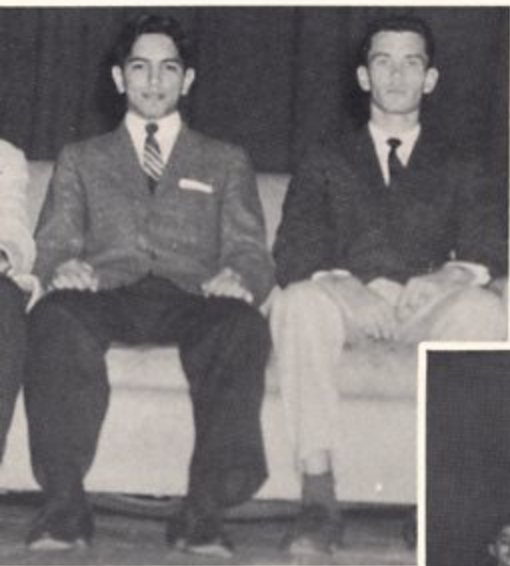

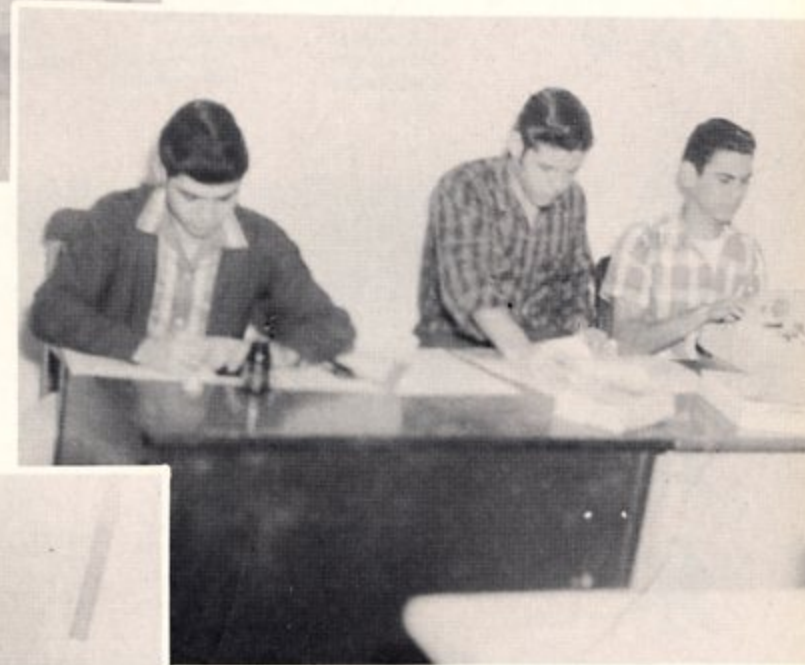

St. Joe Defeats St. Peter, 14-6

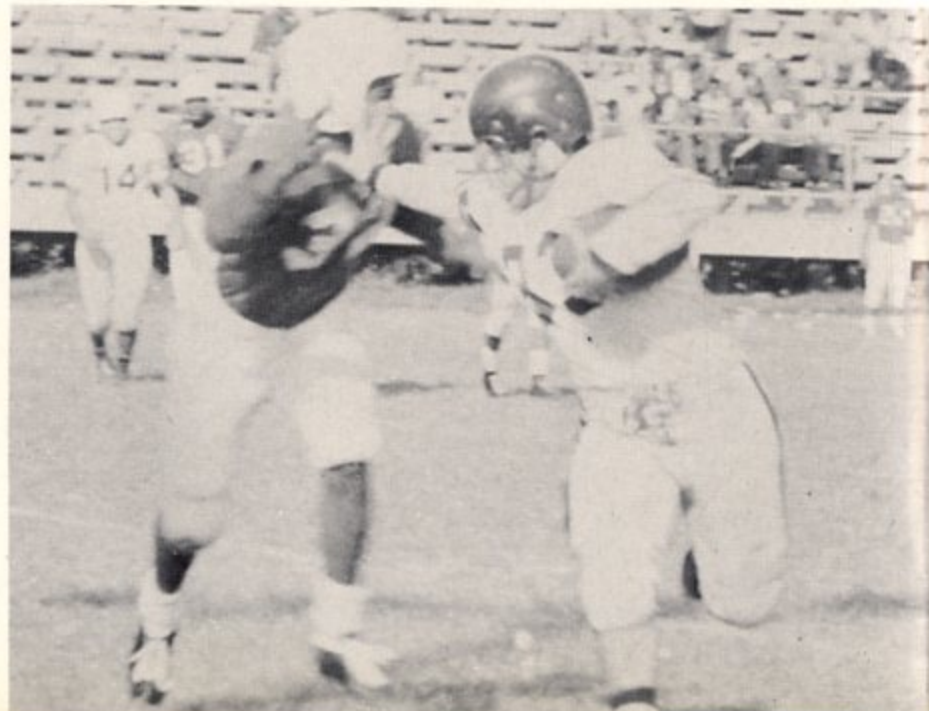

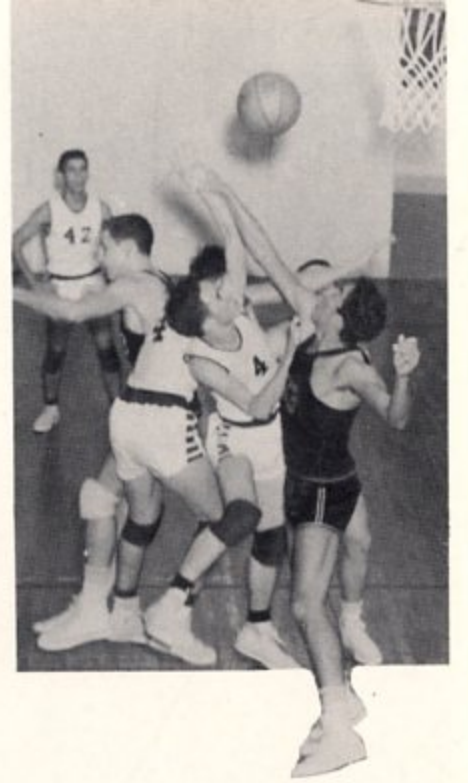

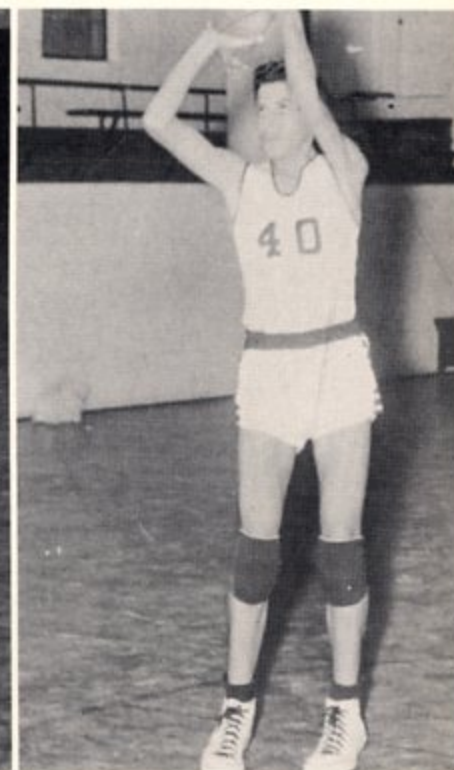

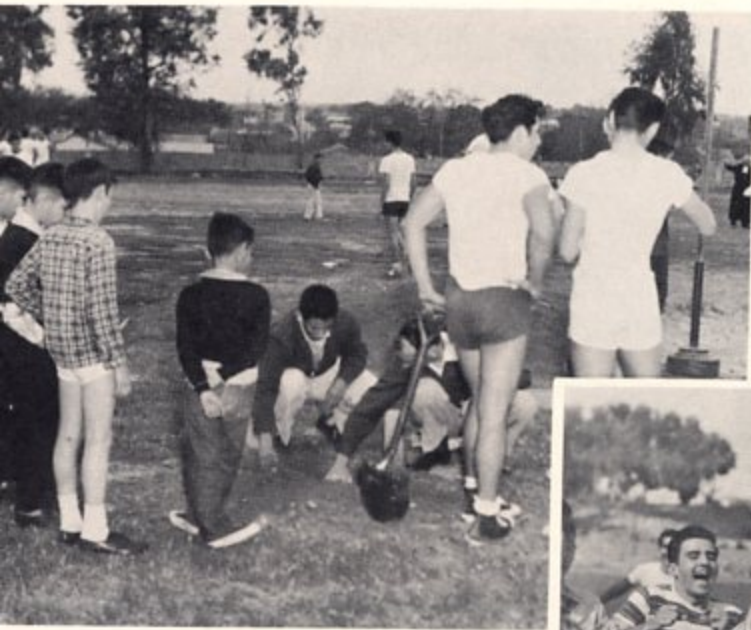
