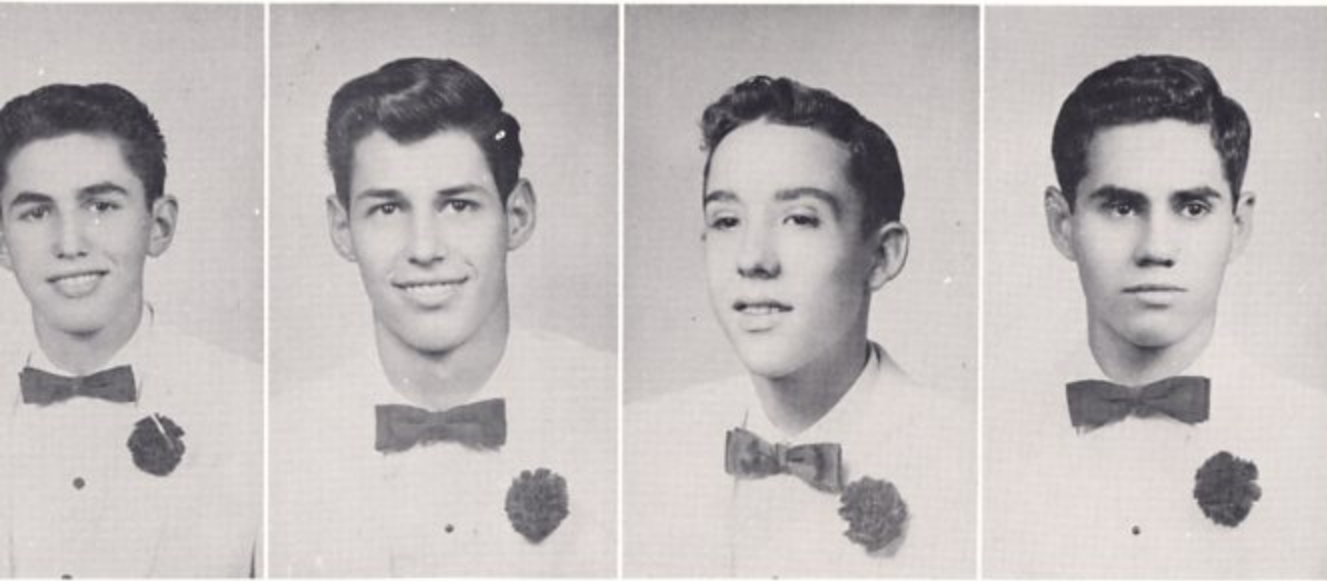

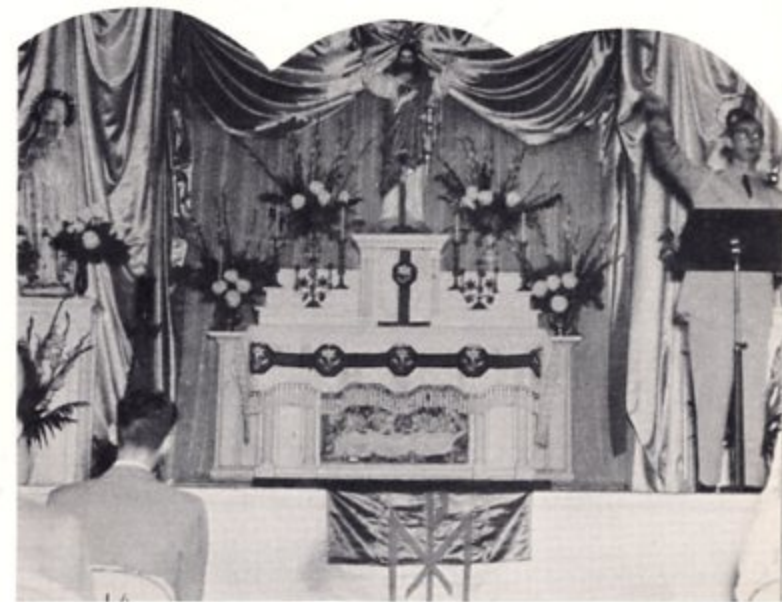

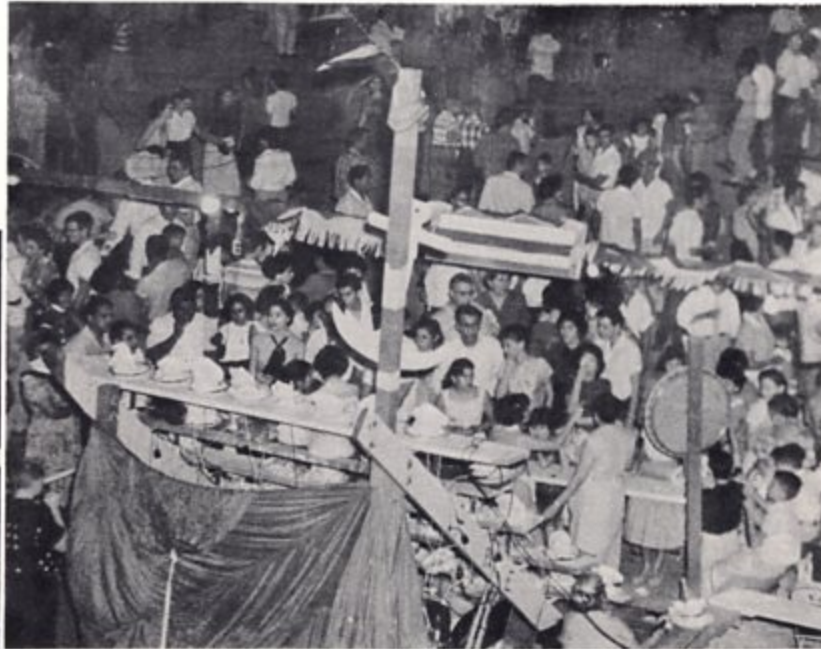

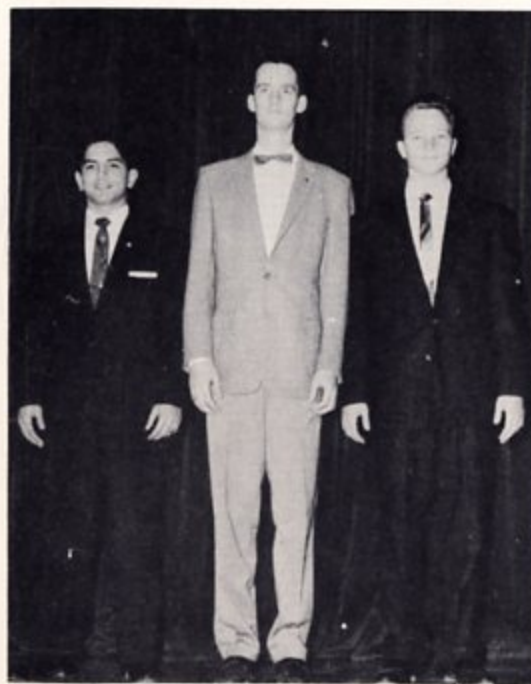

 smash, leaving the halftime score 28-0.



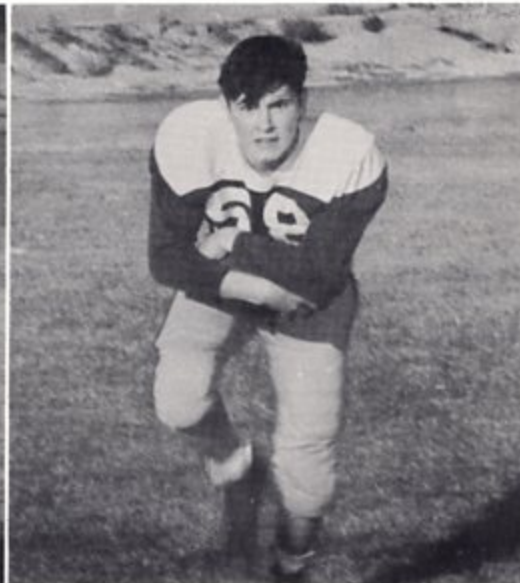
