In the Asherton game, the Antlers turned the tables around and defeated them 28 to 0. This ended the Antler Junior Hi football season.

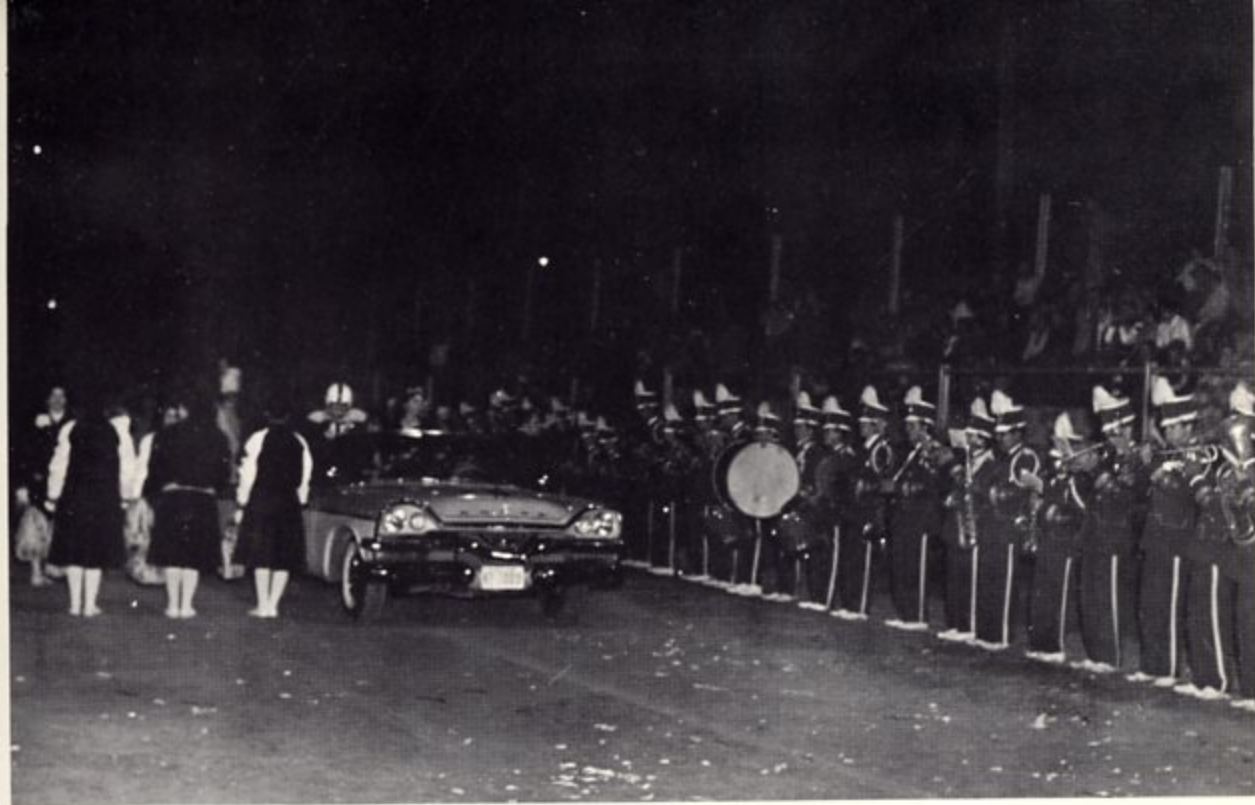

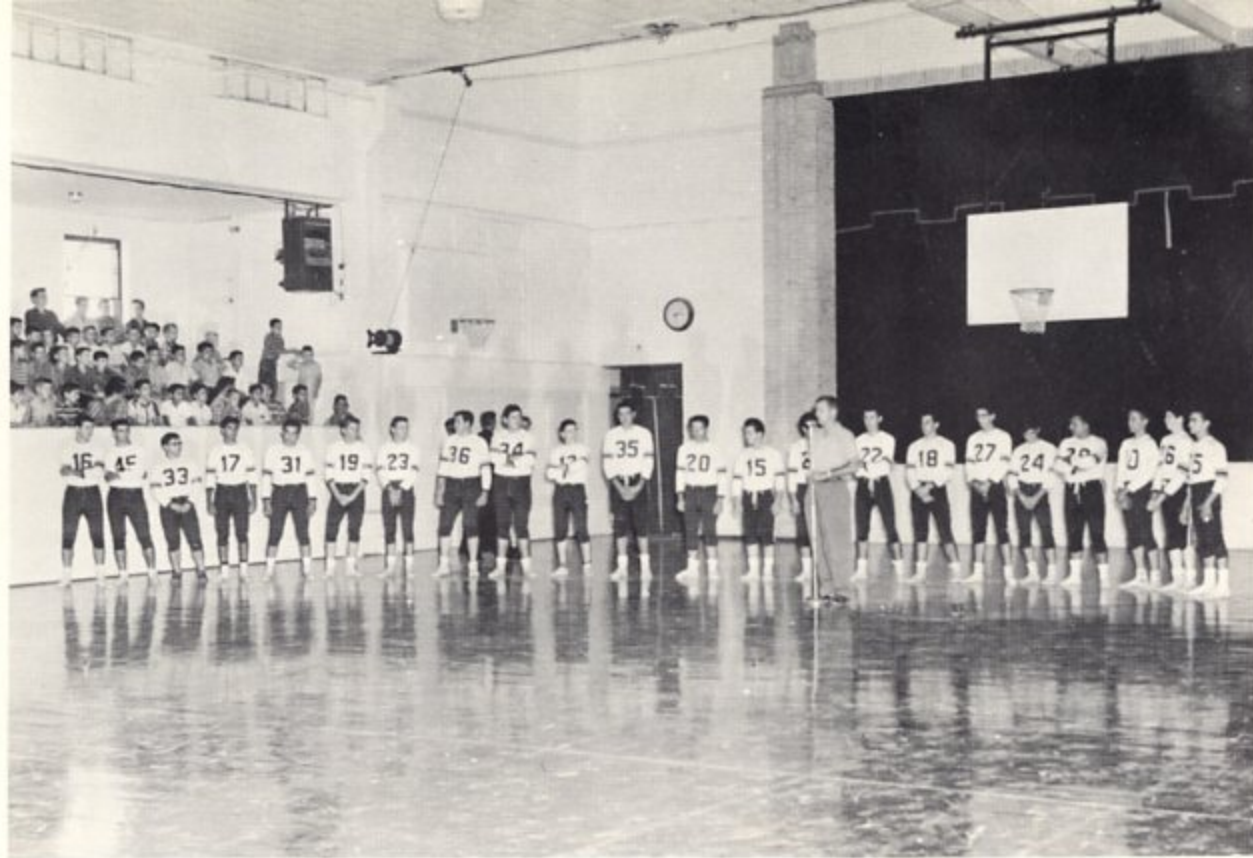

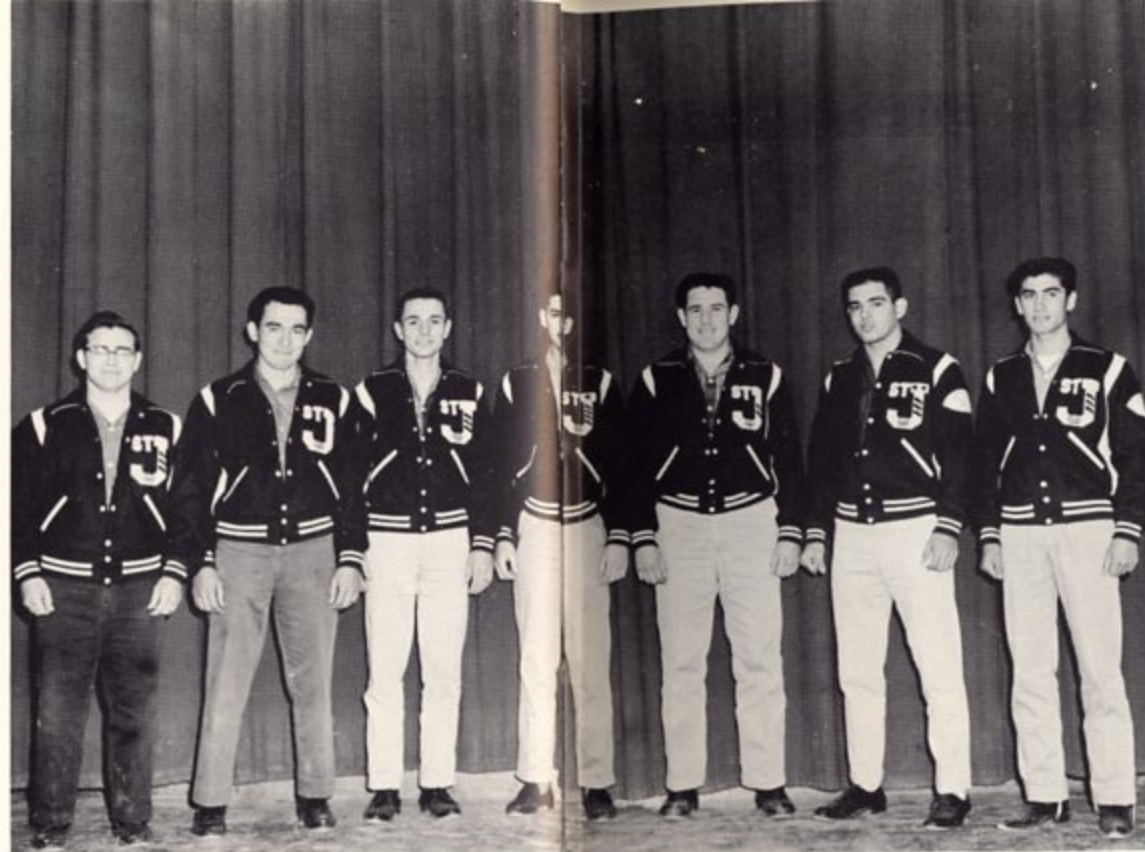
