#### ST. JOSEPH'S 32 BRUNI 8

St. Joseph's Academy Antlers displayed a swift ground attack with a deadly passing game to whip the scrappy but outclassed Bruni Badgers in the season's opener.

The Antlers scored with 3:16 gone in the opening period when quarterback Richard Morales found Johnny Martinez Il alone in the end zone and hit him with a pass. A pass interception by Ralph Garcia set the Antlers in motion again n a 55 yard drive which ended with Richard Morales hitting end Gilbert Menchaca with a 38 yard scoring pass play. The adgers tallied on a 33 yard march which took four plays and quarterback Despain climaxed it by climbing over tackle or a couple of yards for the touchdown. Despain then ran the conversion for 2 points. The half ended with the score t 14 to 8.


The Antlers took the kick-off and marched 61 yards with fullback Isidro Guiterrez racing 22 yards for the score. The xtra point try was missed and at this time the score read 20-8. A second interception by Ralph Garcia set up the fourth ntler score as Sabas Zapata ran the Badger secondary into the end zone on a 38 yard run.

St. Joe took to the air for their last score with 1:30 remaining in the game. Gilbert Menchaca hit halfback Johnny fartinez with a pass on the Bruni 3 yard line, which proved to be another touchdown and ending a 36 yard pass play. he extra point was missed and ended with the Antlers winning 32-8.

#### ST. JOSEPH'S 6 CASTROVILLE 6








