Mike, President of the Senior Class, is an outstanding member of the Student Council and the Sodality.





also the president of the Student Council. In the


classroom Andre likes English and during his leisure





given his support to the Sodality and the Bowling


League. In the classroom Rodolfo's favorite subject

Though Rico has been at the Academy for a short time, he has gained the friendship of many people.


Since his freshman year Rico has participated in the Bowling League as well as being in many class plays. He is presently assistant editor of the yearbook.


Scholastically, Rico ranks Civics as his favorite subject. After graduation he plans to attend the University of the South and study to be a corporation lawyer.

St. Mary's and major in English.




RENATO DE LA GARZA








VICTOR FLORES JR.

EDWARD FREEMAN






RAFAEL GARCIA, JR.



MARIO GONZALEZ DAVIS



ARTURO GUTIERREZ




WILLIAM BYRON JOHNSON, III







The ever smiling Pipe has been active in Football,



ROGELIO QUINTANILLA


