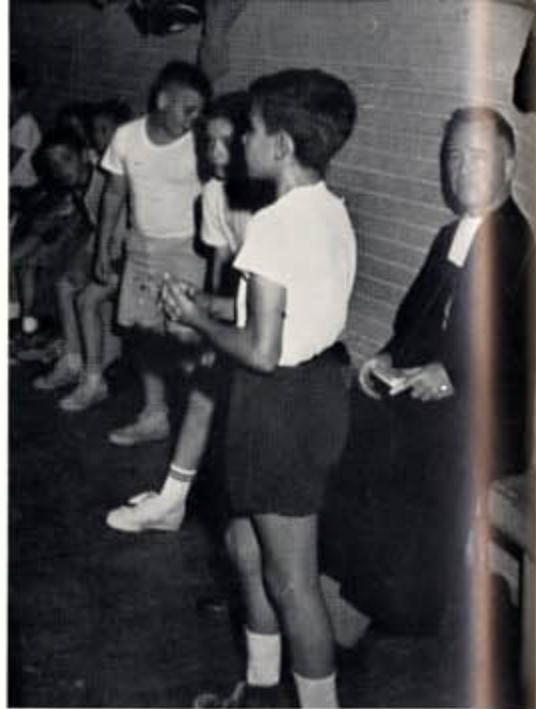

In the early morning of Feb. 21, 1965, more than half a million South Texans lost their spiritual leader.

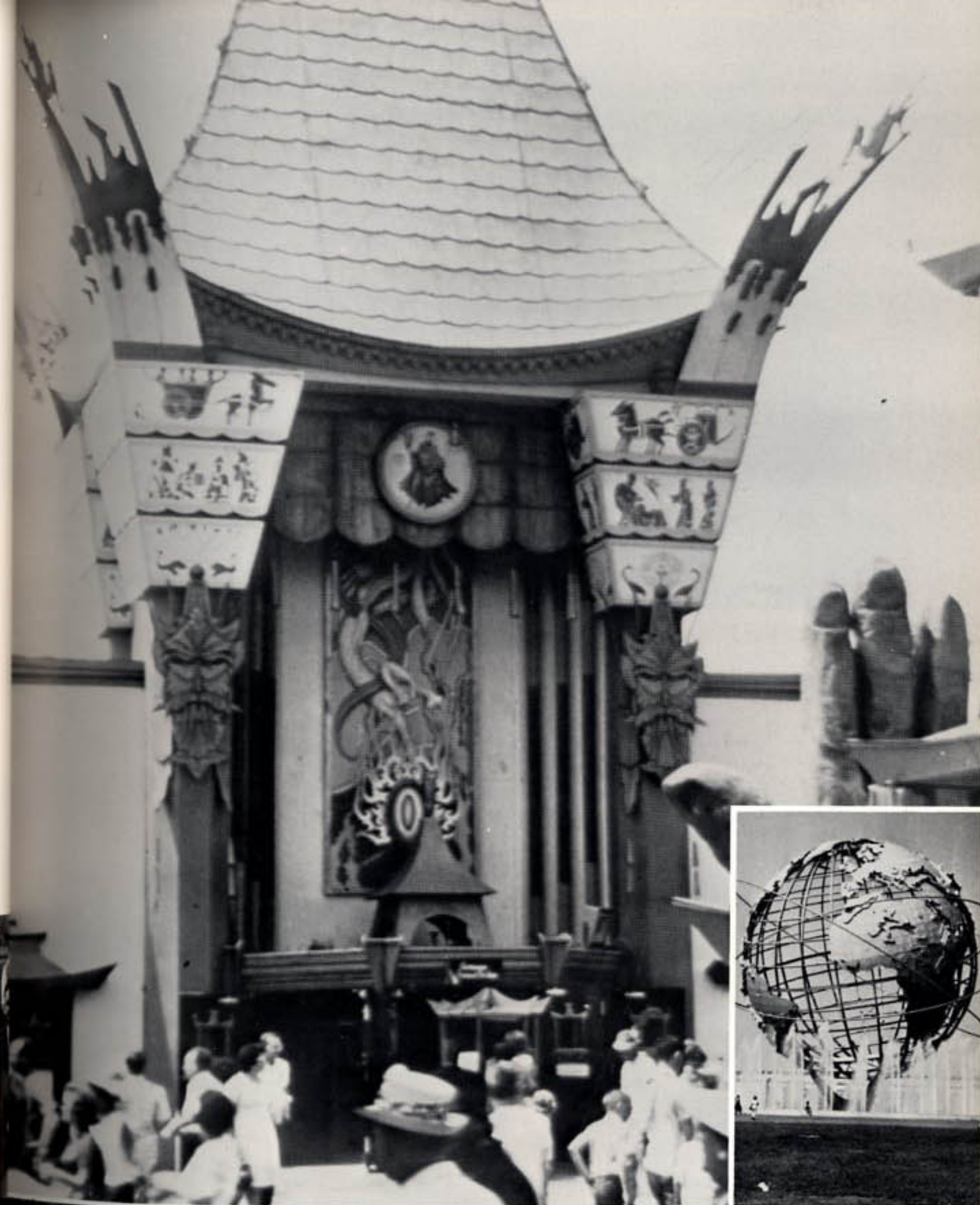

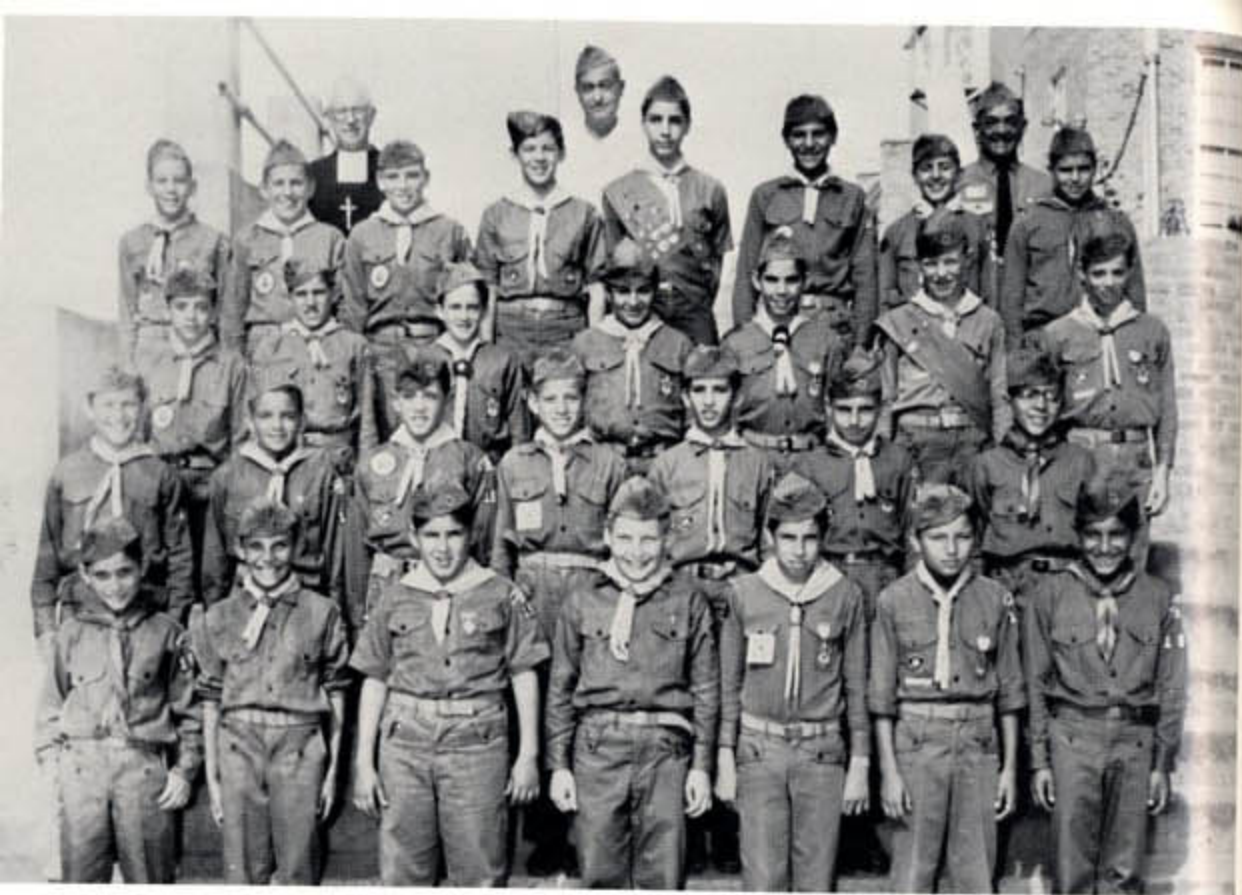
Since his consecration as Bishop in 1936 many schools have been opened in the diocese in an effort to spread the "good news" to his spiritual flock and to stamp out forever the seeds of ignorance. Our own school was numbered among the first in 1937.

Although he is gone from our midst now, the warm affection that he held for faculty and students alike lives on in our memories and the ever advancing standards of education in his diocese remain as lasting testimonials to his interest and devotedness to the field of Christian scholarship.

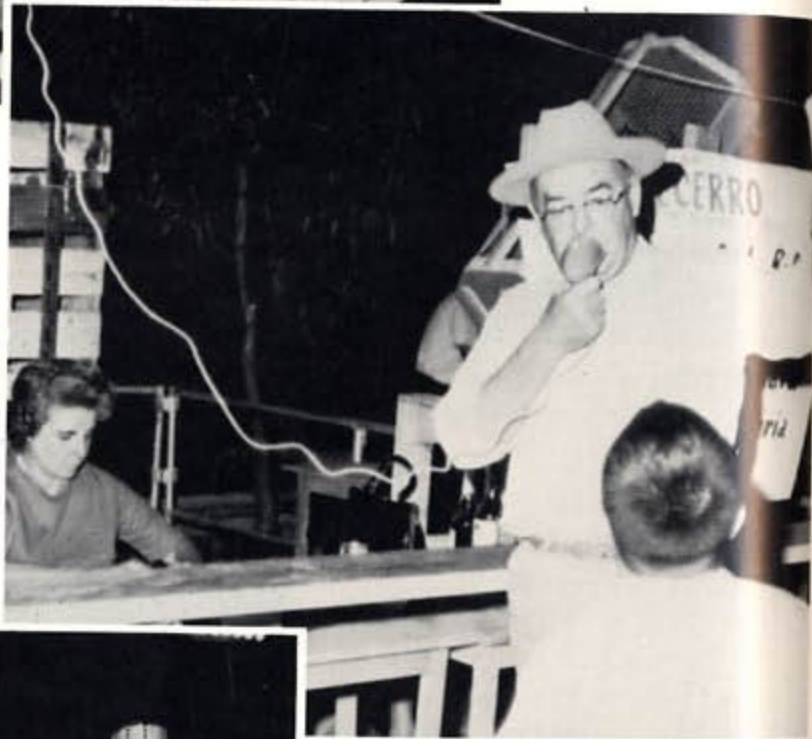

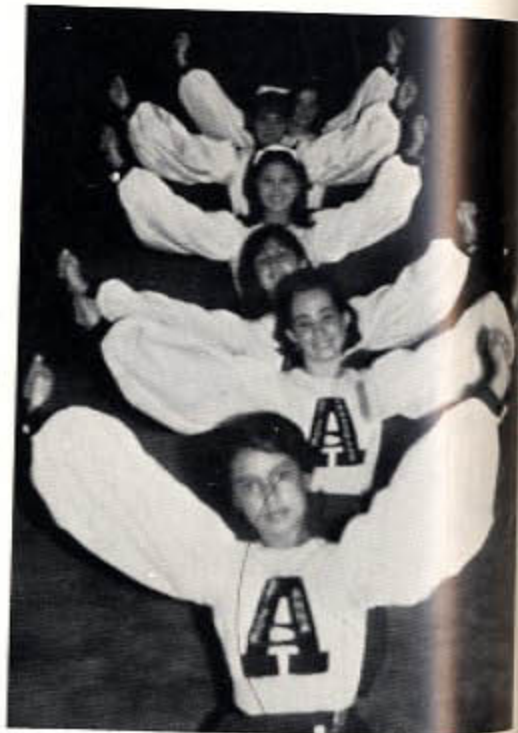

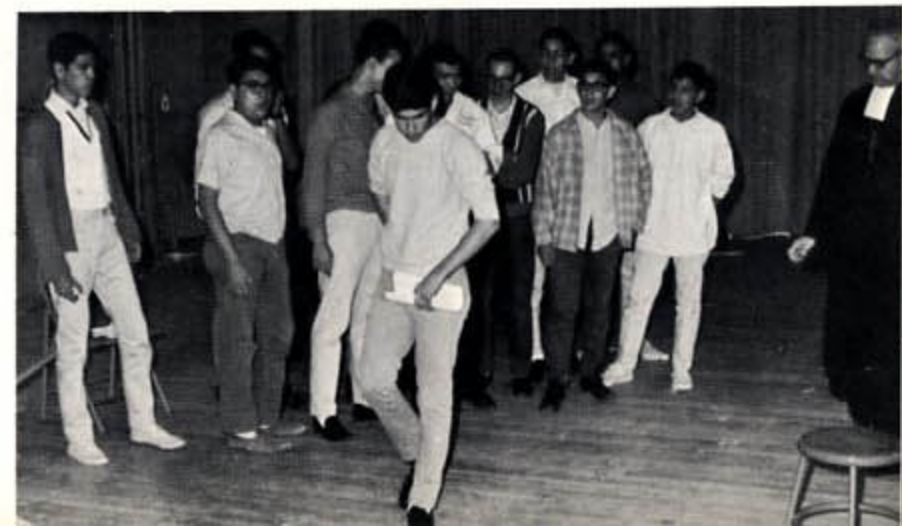

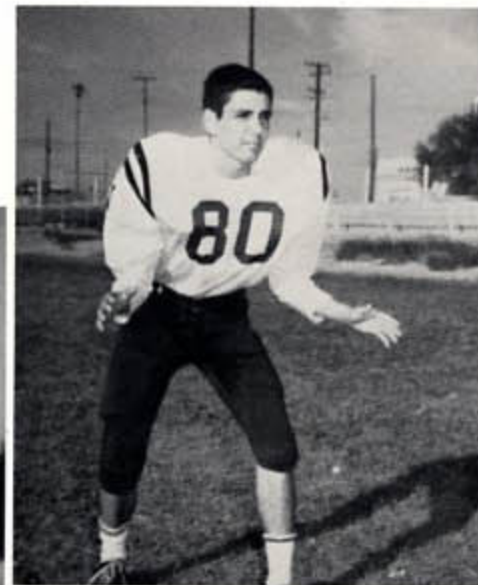

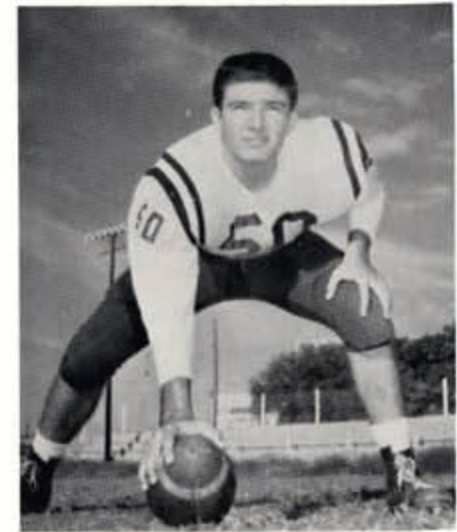

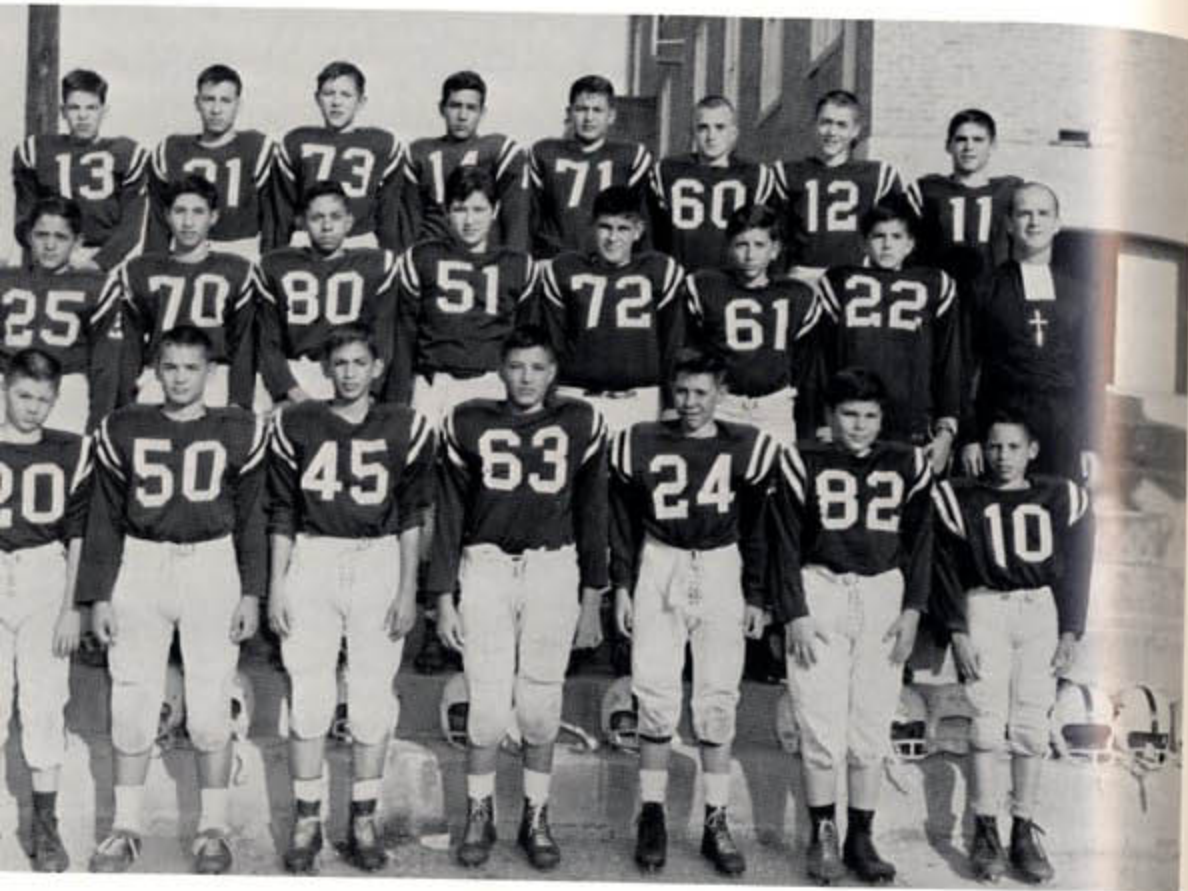

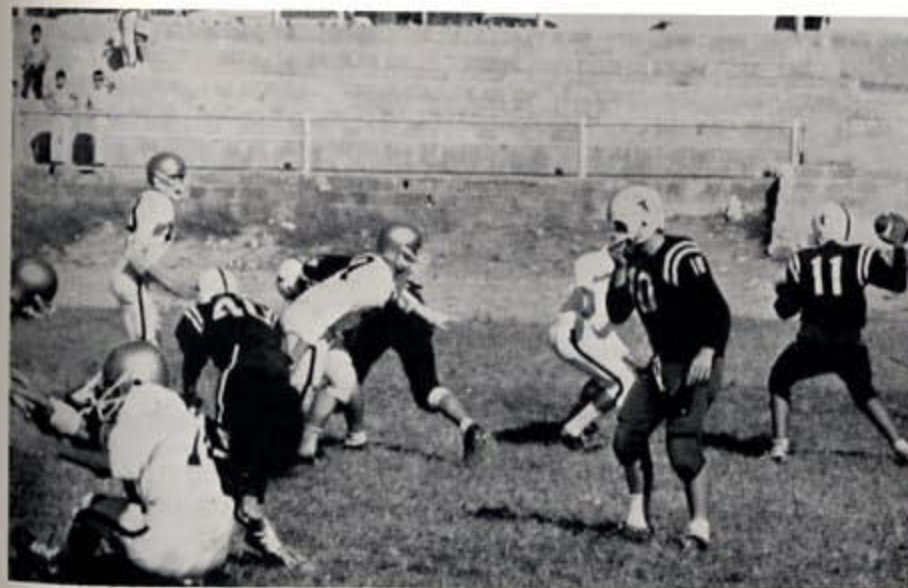
