Rev. Salvador Herbia, better known to Laredoans as Brother John, founded St. Joseph's Academy in 1937. Brother John came to Laredo in 1936. He left five years later to cross the Rio Grande, where he began work on the School of Colegio Mexico in Nuevo Laredo.

He remained in Nuevo Laredo five years, and was appointed director of a Marist Brother school in Mexico City in 1946. Brother John had recently been reappointed to head CUM college in Monterrey shortly before his death.

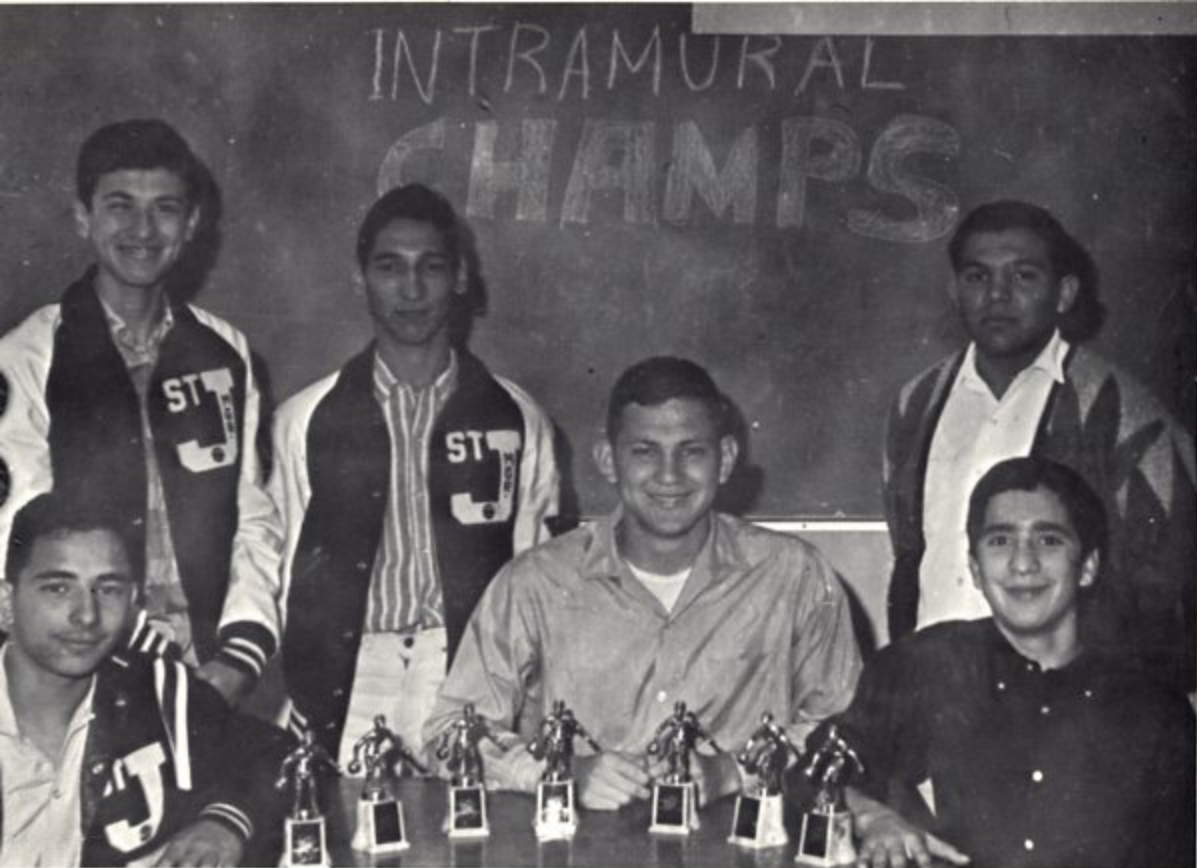

Marist Sesquicentennial

When called to the bedside of a dying boy, a humble and holy young French priest was appalled by a youth's ignorance of the basic truths of his Catholic faith. Then and there, that priest, now known as blessed Marcellin Champagnat, pledged himself to the founding of an order of teaching Brothers to meet the challenge typified by the sad conditions of the dying boy. That was in 1817.

Today, the society which was so humble in its beginnings is known as the Marist Brothers of the Schools. Its membership numbers nearly 10,400 Brothers, divided into thirty-four provinces and spread over fifty-two countries, with missions in Asia, Africa, the Philippines, Japan, and Oceania. The Marist Brothers profess to promote the glory of God and the honor of the Blessed Virgin, their Ordinary Resource, through the apostolate of Catholic schools.

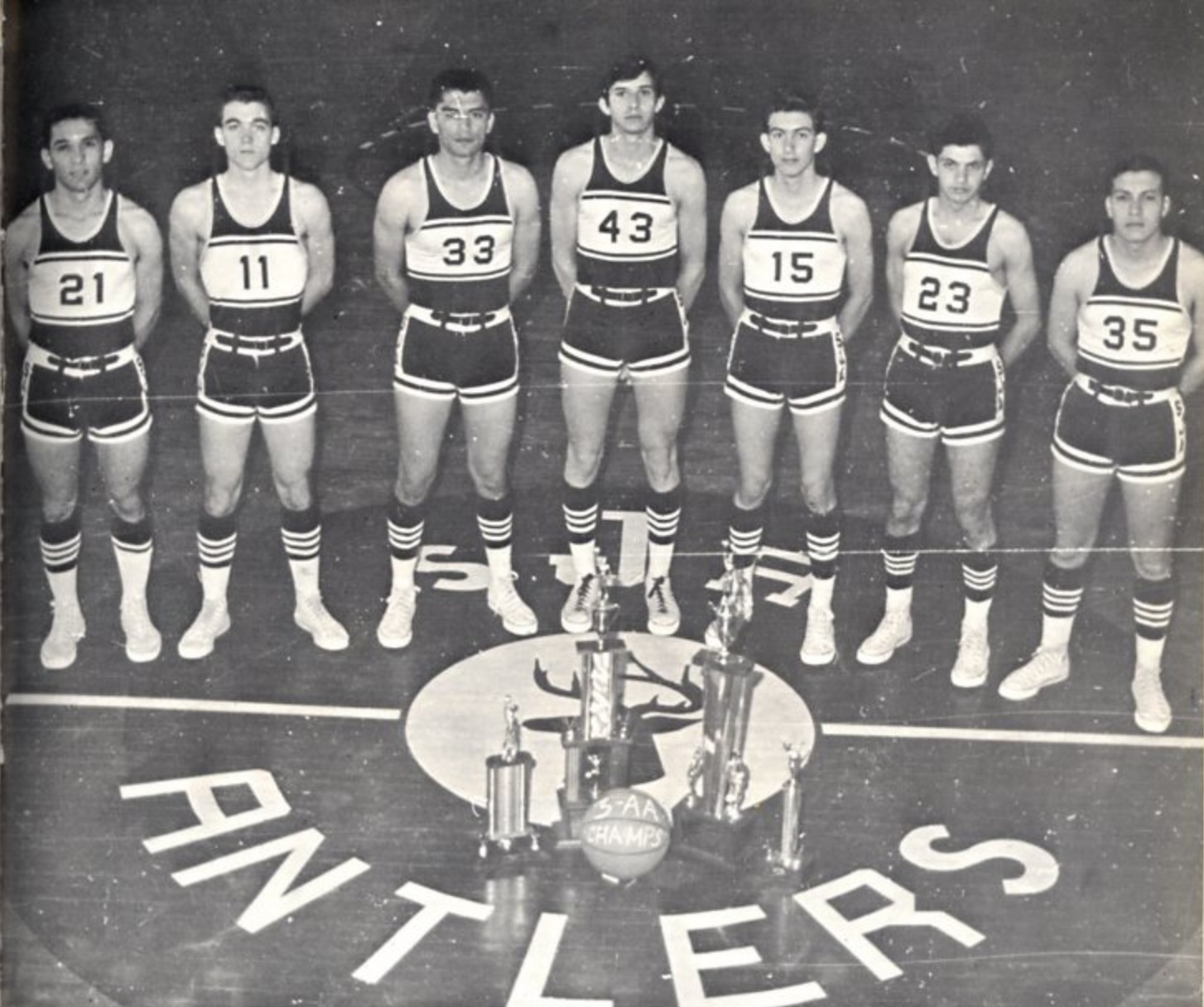

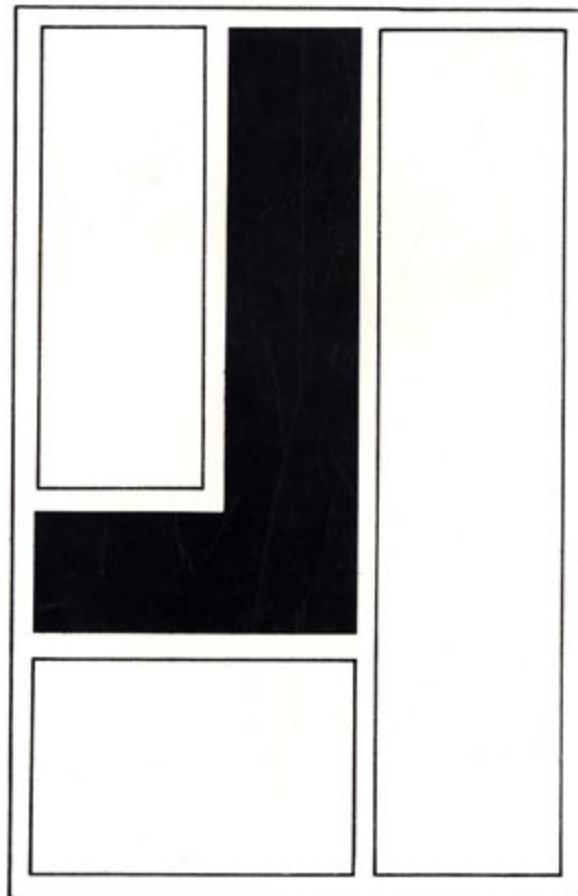
