

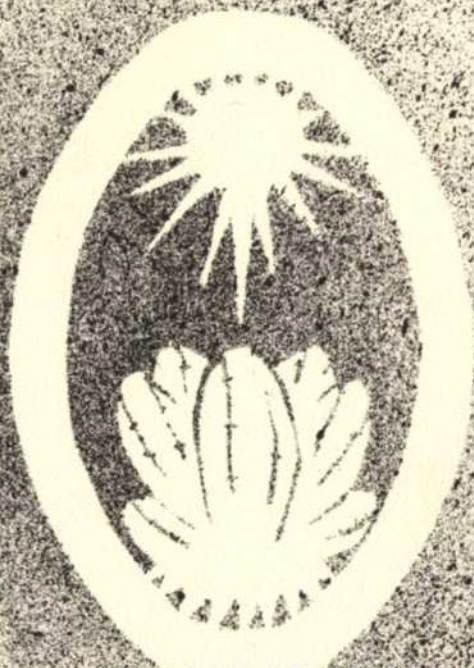

Our music-loving band director, Bill Carrico, was born in Dallas, Texas, on January 1, 1921.

He graduated from high school in Mercedes, Texas, in 1938. Mr. Nixon, of West Texas birth, attended Allen Academy, the University of Texas, and Sul Ross State Teachers' College, where he received his Bachelor of Science degree. He played Varsity football at Texas, lettering at tackle position in '28 and '29, and served as assistant instructor of Physical Training.

Coming here in 1929 as a P.T. instructor in the grades, Mr. Nixon met and later married Miss Josephine Brewster, a Laredo girl. He became principal of Christen Junior High, and in the summer of 1941, "Knobby" was appointed head of M.H.S.

Mr. Nixon has introduced new courses, improved old ones, and worked unceasingly in behalf of the school. Since the war, his special interest has been the veterans, for whom he has arranged schedules, planned their night school, and given needed encouragement. Vitally interested in athletics and youth-building, he enjoys being of service to the community.

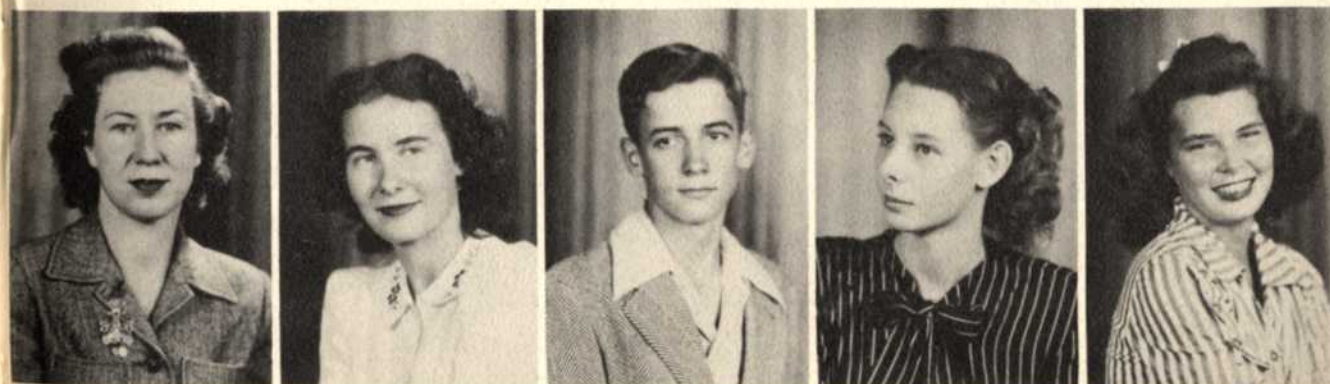
THE NATIONAL THESPIAN DRAMATIC SOCIETY

Organized four years ago for the purpose of rendering service wherever possible, this organization has grown to a membership of one hundred and thirty.

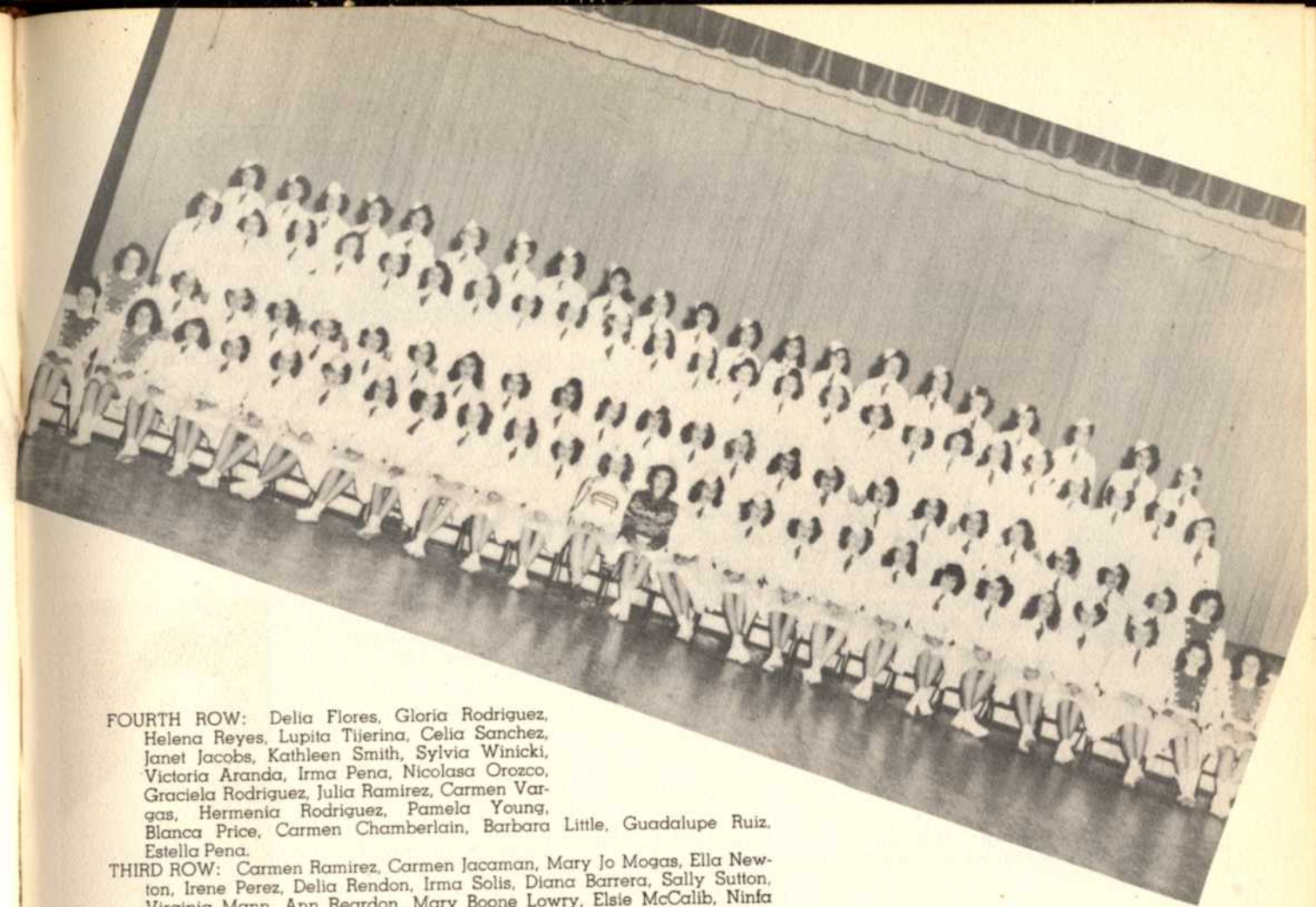

The second half was scoreless and uneventful except for a fumble by the Central backfield which produced a touchback.



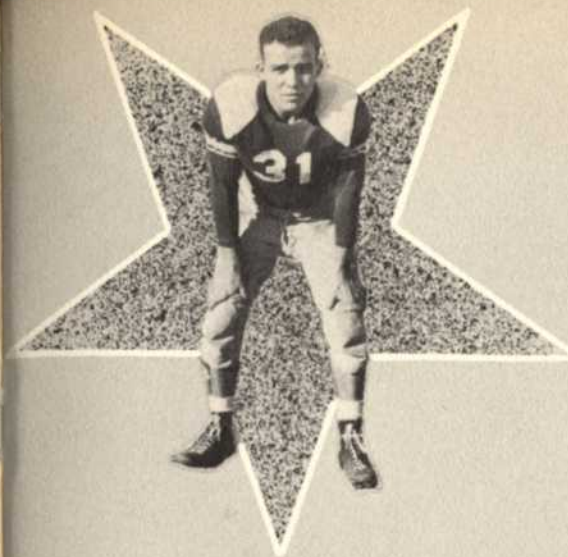
