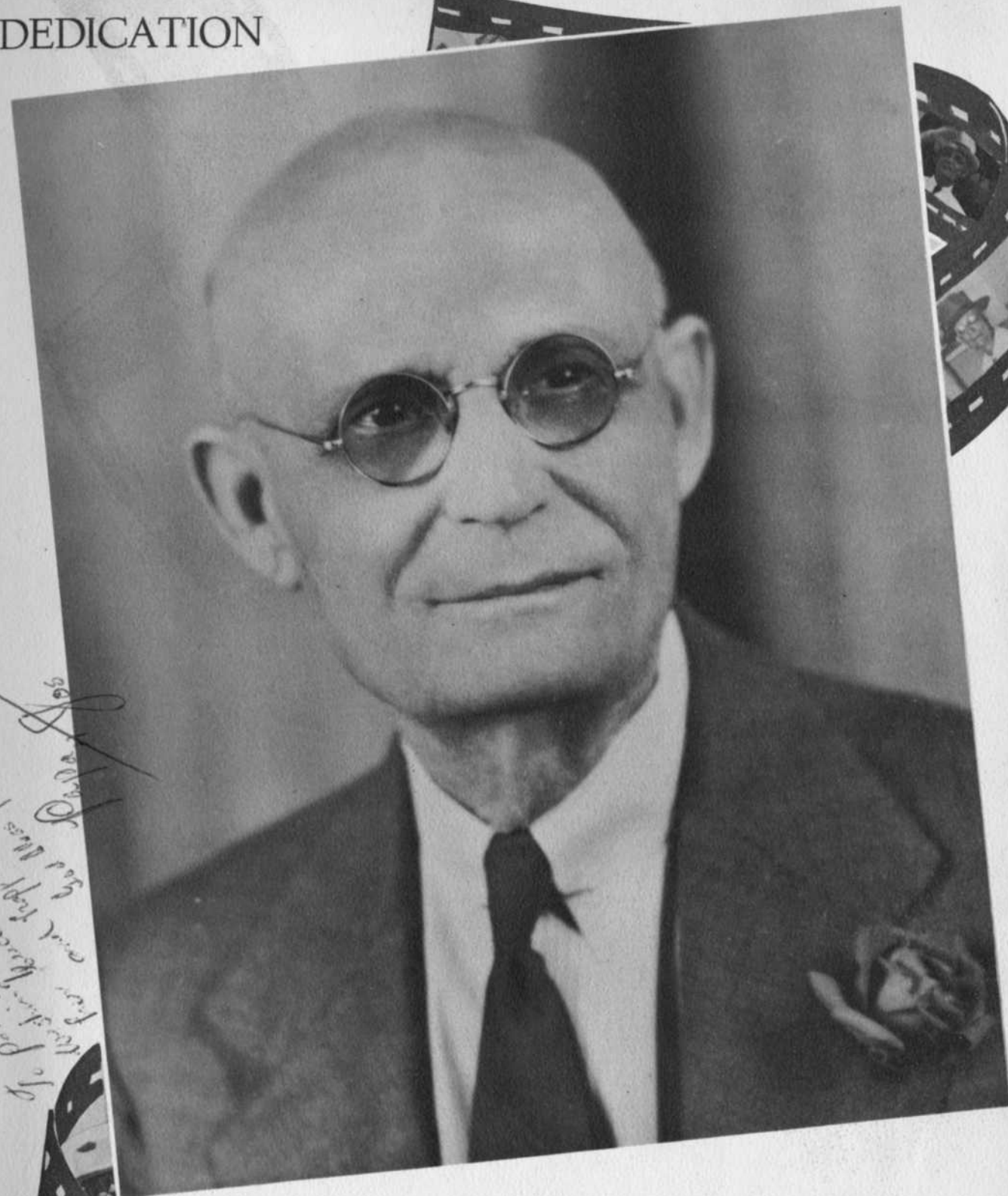
FOREWORD

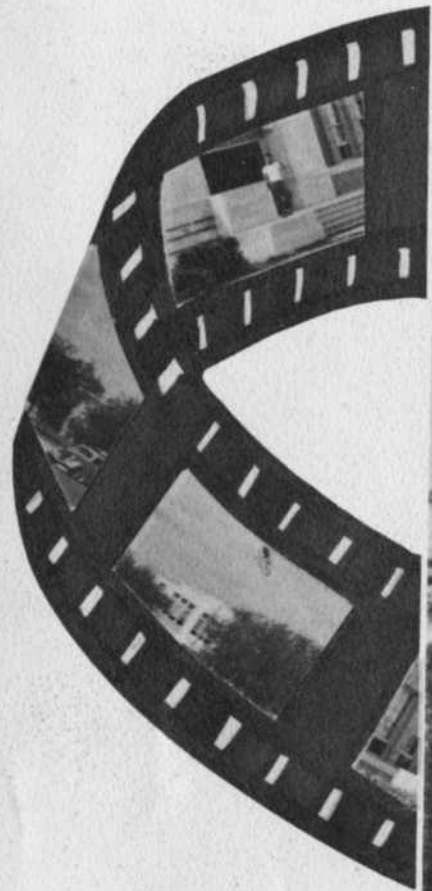

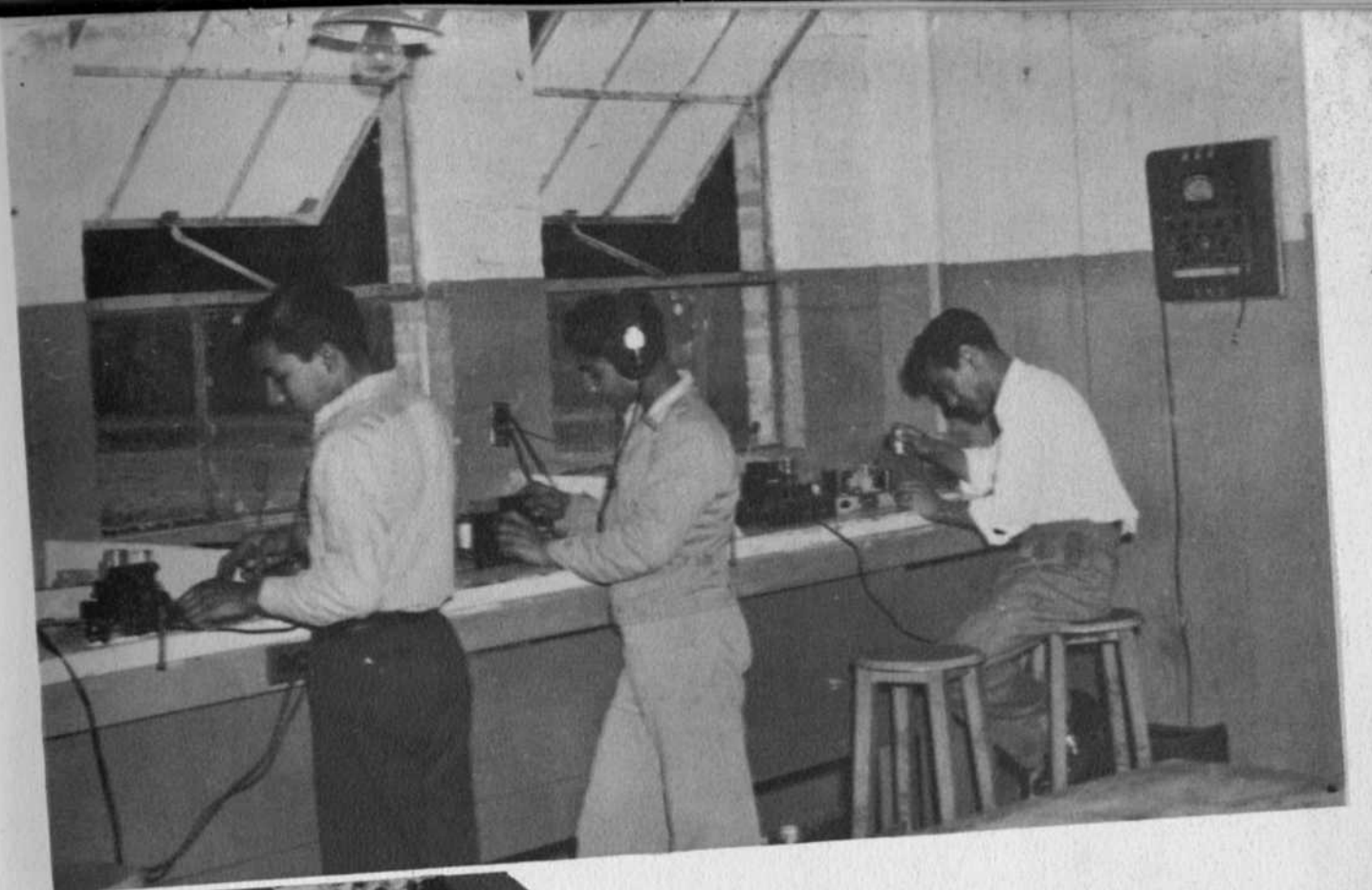
The annual staff is proud to dedicate this 1947 edition to one who is a friend of the students, who in spite of his seventy-five years, is still young in heart.

June 12, 1928 — October 26, 1946

A native of Laredo, he attended Magnon Kindergarten, St. Peter's Parochial School, Ellis Private School, and Laredo Public Schools.

In Martin High School he was in the band. He also belonged to the Typing and Stenography Club, was a Journal columnist, and in the R.O.T.C. He graduated from Martin High School in 1945.

"Paco" entered Texas A. & M. in June 1945. He belonged to the Texas A. & M. Band, The Aggie-land Orchestra, Spanish Club, The A. & M. Newman Club, and the Laredo A. & M. Club. He was a Sergeant in the Cadet Corps.

On October 26, he had attended the Laredo-San Antonio Tech game and was on his way to Waco, where he was going to play in the college band at the Baylor-A. & M. game, in Waco, when the fatal accident occurred.

His passing is deeply felt by his family, his teachers, and his many friends.

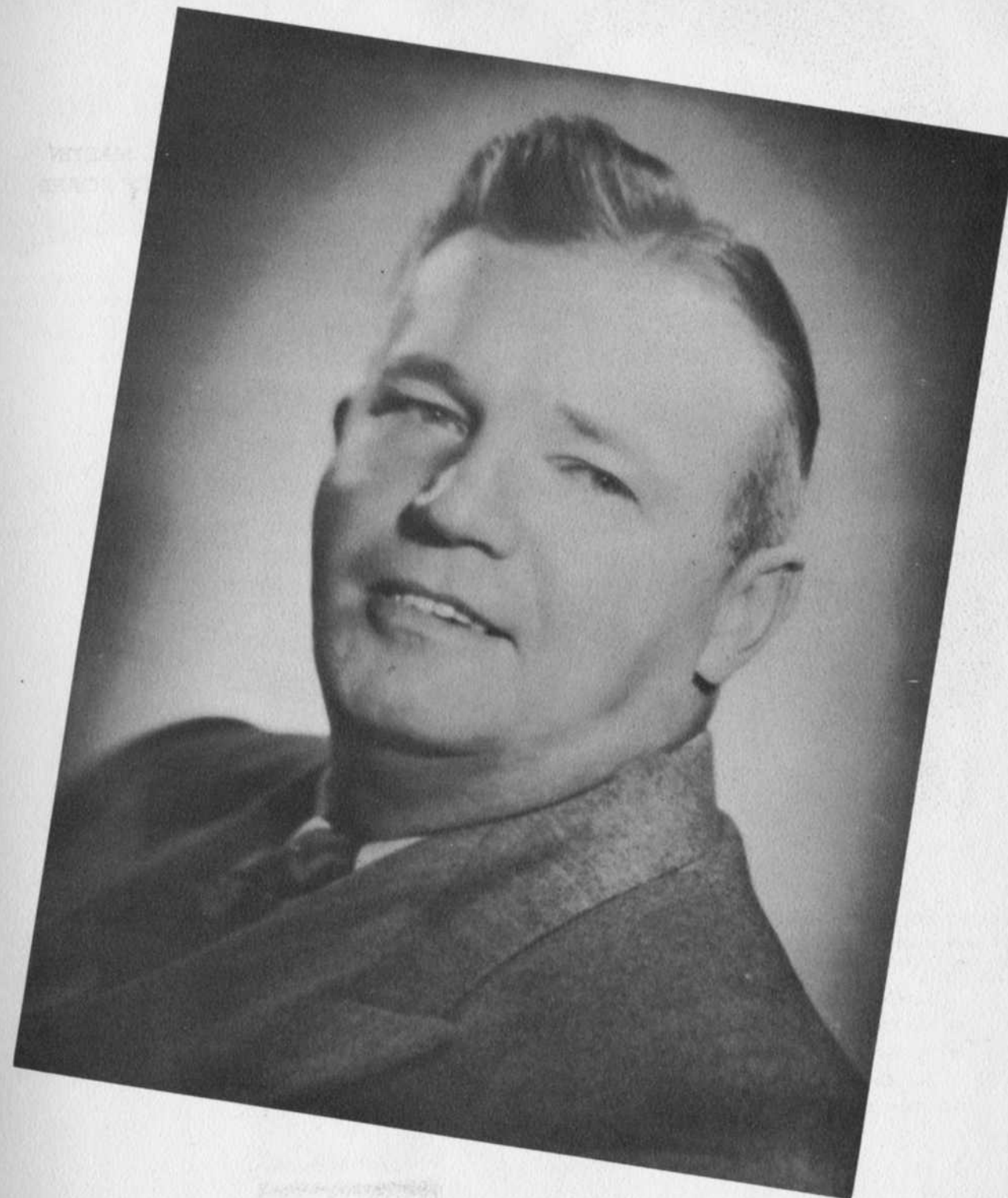


MR. JOE C. MARTIN

Mr. Martin is a native of Laredo. He was educated in Laredo schools and at St. Edward's University. In addition to his life-long interest in politics, he is owner of a large ranch.

He has always been interested in the education of the youth of Laredo because he recognizes the value of education in our democratic way of life.



MR. J. W. NIXON, SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Resignation of W. P. Galligan as city superintendent of schools resulted in the appointment of J. W. Nixon, principal of Martin High School, to fill the office. On his appointment Mr. Nixon stated in the Journal for September 24, 1947, "I sincerely appreciate the honor and trust bestowed upon me by the board of trustees of the Laredo Independent School District, and the work and accomplishments of my predecessor, W. P. Galligan, will serve as an incentive toward higher standards to be accomplished in our school system."

Mr. Nixon has been in Laredo since 1929, when he supervised physical education in the elementary grades. In 1930 he was made athletic director at L. J. Christen Junior High School; then, principal in 1936. He has served as high school principal since 1941.

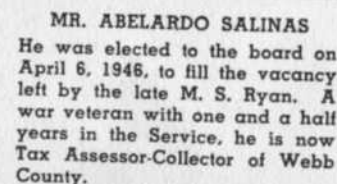

He is the affable mayor of Laredo; also serves as business manager of the school board.

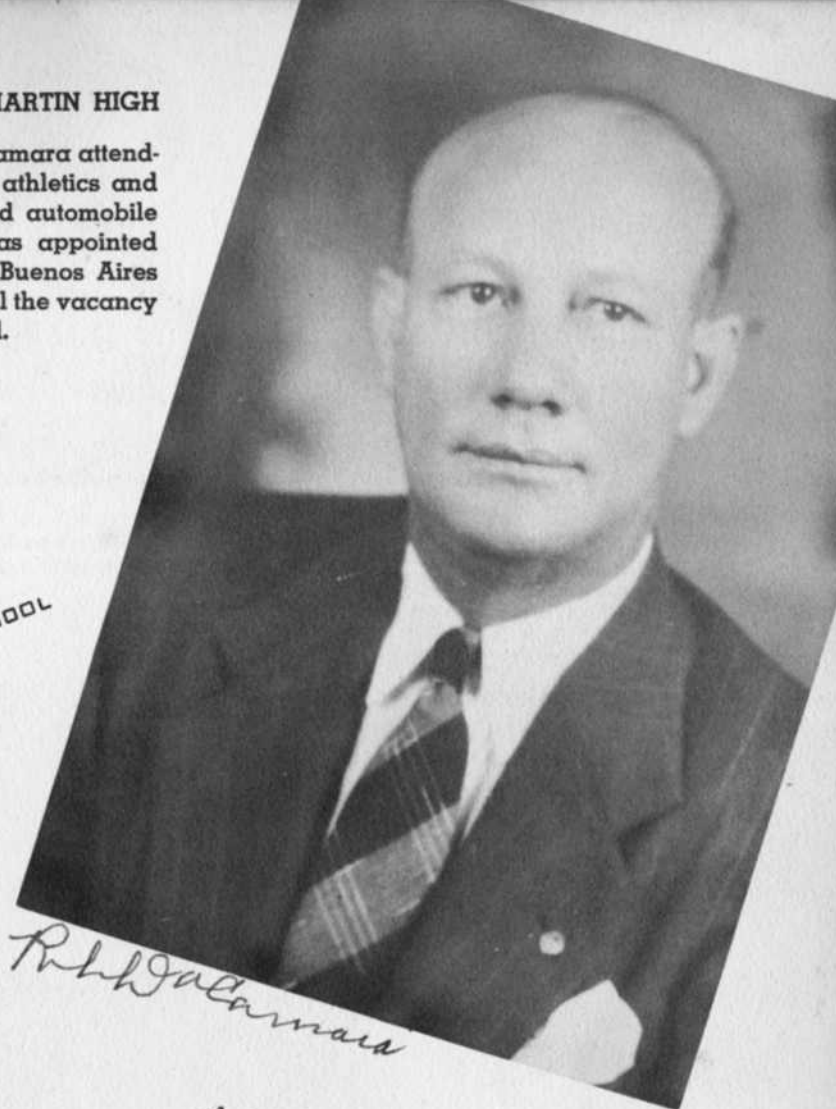


MR. ABELARDO SALINAS

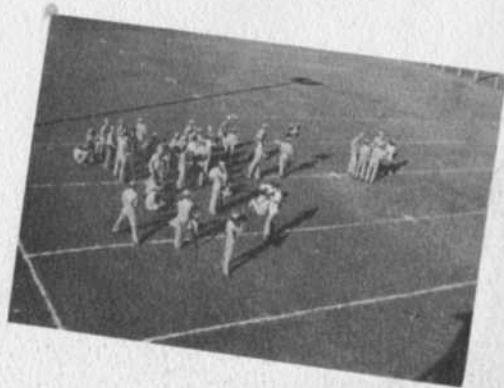

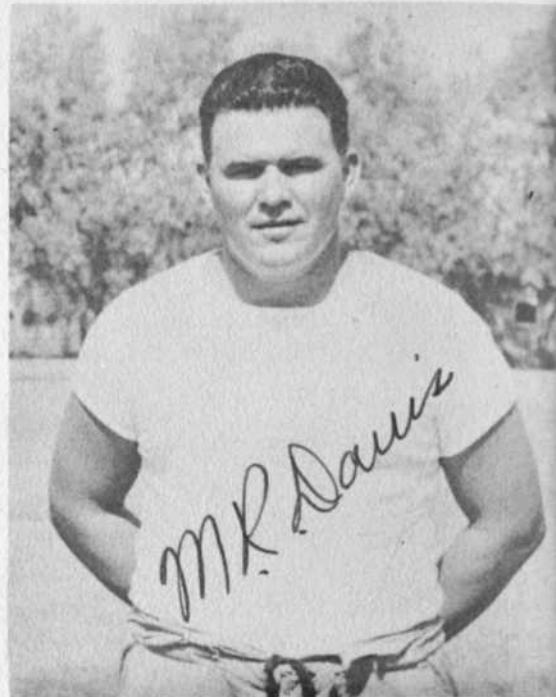


R. W. PARKER, Head Coach

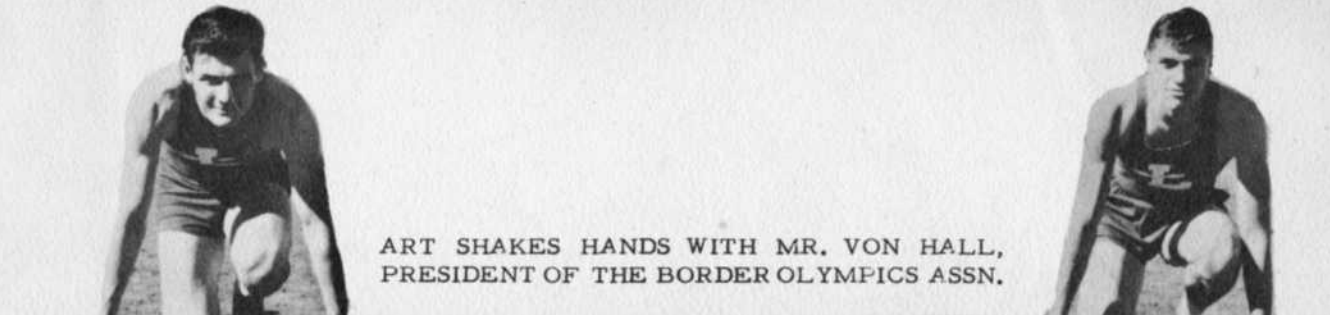
