
# FOREIMEN












Strolling west on our campus, one encounters a low one-storied brick building, where the lights burn late at night. This is the Trades and Industries Building, which houses the metals work shop, the auto mechanics, the vocational agriculture, the art department, and the R.O.T.C.

### GYMNASIUM ENTRANCE

Gymnasium entrance admits school patrons to basketball games, civic music concerts, and various benefit dances. The windows above the entrance are in the band room. Housing the band in this wing of the building prevents classes from being disturbed by music.





### LAREDO INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE

On June 30, 1954, the concrete arch bridge between the United States and Mexico washed out when the Rio Grande River reached an all time

After satisfactory arrangements had been made between the Mexican Government and the City of Laredo, construction was started on the present bridge on August 20, 1955. This is the only continuous beam design, pre-stressed concrete bridge in the Americas. This design excels in beauty of line as well as in economy.

This bridge is also the only bridge that has removable railings. In case of a flood the railings may be removed in less than an hour.




























