Revealing even on her deathbed a true nobility of spirit, Etta Mae Maschke, who grew up here in Laredo as Etta Mae Niendorff, requested that her eyes be given to the eye bank for transplant to a sightless person. Imagine having one's last thought calculated at providing the marvelous gift of sight for one who has known only darkness!

She had been teaching English at Martin High School for the past two years. She attended the University of Texas, Texas College of Arts and Industries, and Denver University. Etta Mae was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, and she was active with the Pan American Round Table, Luncheon Club, and the Laredo Art Association. She was the niece of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Russell of Laredo and lived at the Russell home.

Etta Mae's total personality was a most glowing one. She was always aware of others, beautifully mannered, poised, a fond friend, intensely interested in her pupils, to whom she gave more than the contents of a text book. She brought to the classroom her culture, her background in literature, music, and art and her knowledge of the world's geography, for she had been to Europe twice before the last odyssey that ended so tragically in a Dallas hospital.

A number of her former pupils asked if they might not write a tribute to her, and one student completed a little poem. Etta Mae's influence on the young minds with whom she came in contact will indeed stretch far down the pathway of the future.



BIOGRAPHY OF RAYMOND AND TIRZA MARTIN

Martin High School is named for Raymond and Tirza Martin, and we of another century wish to know more about this couple, prominent in Laredo in the latter decades of the last century, who were the forebears of Laredo's Mayor J. C. Martin Jr., Mr. Albert Martin, Mrs. Herlinda Martin de Gutierrez, Miss Luisa Martin, and Mrs. Mamie Martin de Garcia.



Six of their children have passed away: Raymond V. Martin, Marcelino G. Martin, John M. Martin, Joe C. Martin, Mrs. Antonia Martin de Martin, and Mrs. Magdalena Martin de Bruni.

Raymond Martin was a Frenchman born in Aauzas, France, on May 31, 1828, the son of Jean Marie Martin, a merchant. He was reared to mercantile pursuits along with his brothers Paul and Joseph, who also came to America, according to Southwest Texas, published in 1907.

After being in the United States two years, Raymond, in 1854, came to Laredo where he opened a store. He was also a pioneer in sheep raising in Webb County, beginning in 1861, and for many years was the largest raiser in this section. At times over 50,000 sheep, as well as thousands of head of cattle, grazed in his pastures.

One of his family recalls going to the ranch at sheep shearing time and seeing thousands of bags of wool cut and sent to market.

He also began raising cattle

and accumulated large tracts of land in Webb and La Salle counties. In 1907 the Raymond Martin estate included 130,000 acres of land.

Mr. Martin sold his store in 1887, erected the Commercial Hotel, became one of the organizers of the Laredo Bank, and of the city water works.

He married Miss Tirza Garcia, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bartolome Garcia, an old and prominent family of the city. She was a direct descendant of Don Tomas Sanchez and through her mother was kin to the prominent Madero family of Mexico.

Tirza was only 17 at the time of her marriage, and Raymond was in his forties. They had a perfect life together. Tirza was always pleased and her husband would say, "Hay que Tirza!" accepting happily whatever his wife wished.

Their ten children were perfectly disciplined and rarely misbehaved. The family was knit together by ties of love which held down through the years. Although Raymond died in 1900, his widow carried on his affairs, rearing the family and dying in 1910.



When the new high school building was begun in 1936, it was named for the parents of Albert Martin, at that time Mayor of the city of Laredo, and of Joe C. Martin Sr., who was then president of the Board of the Laredo Independent School District and the sheriff of Webb County.

It is to the memory of this couple for whom our Alma Mater is named that we proudly dedicate our 1965 issue of LA PITAHAYA.



WHY LA PITAHAYA?

In 1916 the first volume of La Pitahaya appeared, published by the students of Laredo High School, which boasted a class of sixteen seniors. This first volume was dedicated to Miss Katherine Tarver, then a teacher at Laredo High School. Mr. L. J. Christen was Superintendent of Schools. This first yearbook from the only Laredo high school was published under the title La Pitaya; by 1917, volume 2 had become La Pitahaya: a Yearbook of the Laredo High School.

Why the choice of a cactus for the year-book title? We can surmise. The University of Texas yearbook was called *The Cactus*, and the university was well known by both the faculty and many of the seniors who aspired to attend it. It seems rational that the name of a specific kind of cactus—one very common to the Laredo area—would give the yearbook title great originality. Also, the dual meaning of a "pitahaya," which was not only a thing of beauty in its spring blossoms of cerise pink, but also served as food to the cowboys who would eat the fruit while taking their cattle to graze on the great plains of Texas, was favorable.

Between the years 1930 and 1936, La Pitahaya went into oblivion, and in 1937, the year Commencement Exercises were held in the newly completed gym of Raymond and Tirza Martin High School, the dedication of the annual went to its sponsor, Mrs. Elizabeth Sorrell, the only teacher in the history of the yearbook who has received two dedications, the second one being in 1963.

In the foreword of the 1937 yearbook can be found the quotation, "It is the hope of the staff with such an important year to record, *La Pitahaya* of 1937 cannot fail to become one of the best loved annuals published by the Laredo High School."

This is also our hope in 1965!










THE BOYS' CLUB OF LAREDO







Work on organizing the Courtesy Service Club began in the spring of 1934 under the direction of Miss Midge Gerling. The idea of a Courtesy Service Club was first presented by Mr. C. E. Wade, principal of Laredo High School and later Superintendent of the Kingsville schools. The purpose of the organization was to have a service and a drill group combined, but by fall the drill part was judged too much if the girls were to give their best service. Mrs. Kate Andrews assisted in the

spring and summer, but in the fall of 1934 Miss Gerling was unable to resume teaching, and Miss Virginia Champitte, a physical education teacher, took over the sponsorship for that year. Miss Gerling resumed sponsorship in 1935, and when she left Laredo in 1937, Miss Adele Wildenthal became sponsor until 1943. Mrs. Kate Andrews was then appointed sponsor until 1951 when Mrs. Blanche Wright was asked to sponsor the organization. In 1957 Miss Elia Montemayor, now a teacher at Nixon High School, became the club sponsor until 1962, when she did graduate study at the University of Texas, during which time Mrs. Wright resumed sponsorship. At present Mrs. Nelda Guardiola is sponsor and Miss Martha Fasci is co-sponsor.

The purpose of Courtesy Service is service to the community and to the school with courtesy. Mr. Wade wanted an organized group of the "cream-of-the-crop" girls in high school on whom he could call when any help was needed in the community or in the school.

The original idea was that a CSC girl should conduct herself at all times, whether on duty or not, in such a way that no teacher could complain. A CSC girl was to represent a teacher in any work that she was called on to do.

CSC members are nominated by faculty and members. No member can vote against a nominee, but two faculty members can delay a girl's membership for a semester if they feel that the girl is not ready for CSC work. In the past decade a "B" average has been required.



Organized in 1954, the Robert E. Lee Chapter of the National Honor Society is entitled to have a membership of fifteen percent of the Senior Class enrollment. 



To wind up the festivities the Laredo Public Schools present the Dance Festival, a most delightful event in which hundreds of Laredo children take part. and high schools take part in the stiff competition. The Military Review and the annual Commencement Exercises of Martin High also take place at Shirley Stadium.

After four quarters of thrills and suspense before a four thousand capacity crowd, the final score was Martin 34 to Nixon's 0. 
