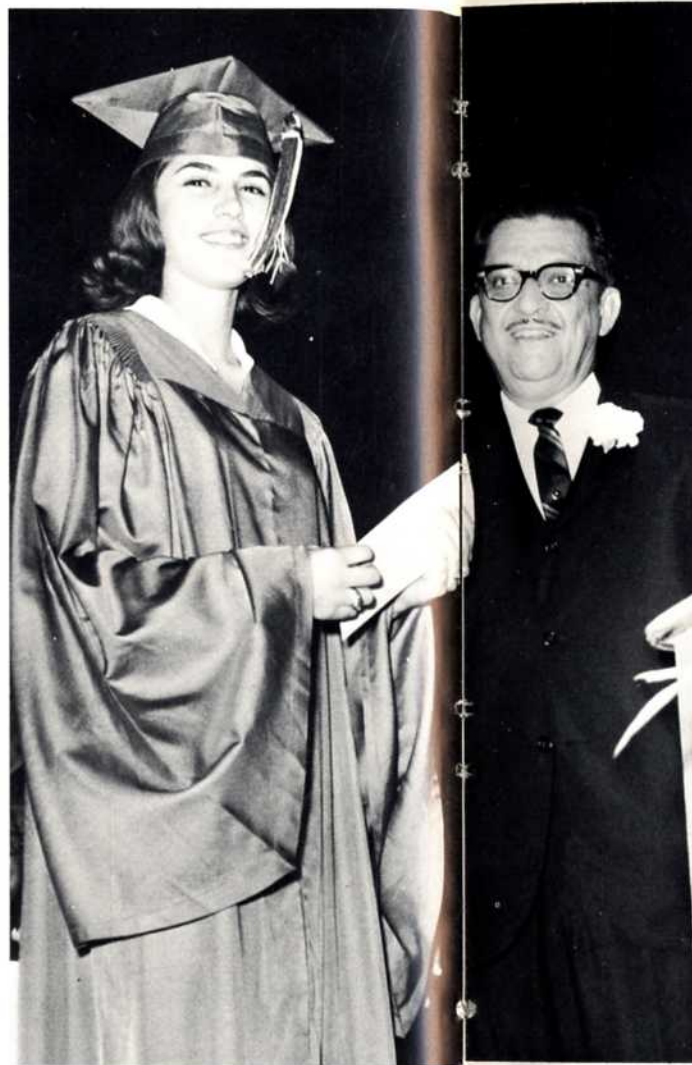
Edward Walker, outstanding senior and Thespian, first-vice president of his class, served as Master of Ceremonies for the occasion and introduced the court.

Colonel Hein, admired by all the student body, was the first speaker of the orientation program and welcomed all the sophomores with a hearty, outstanding speech.

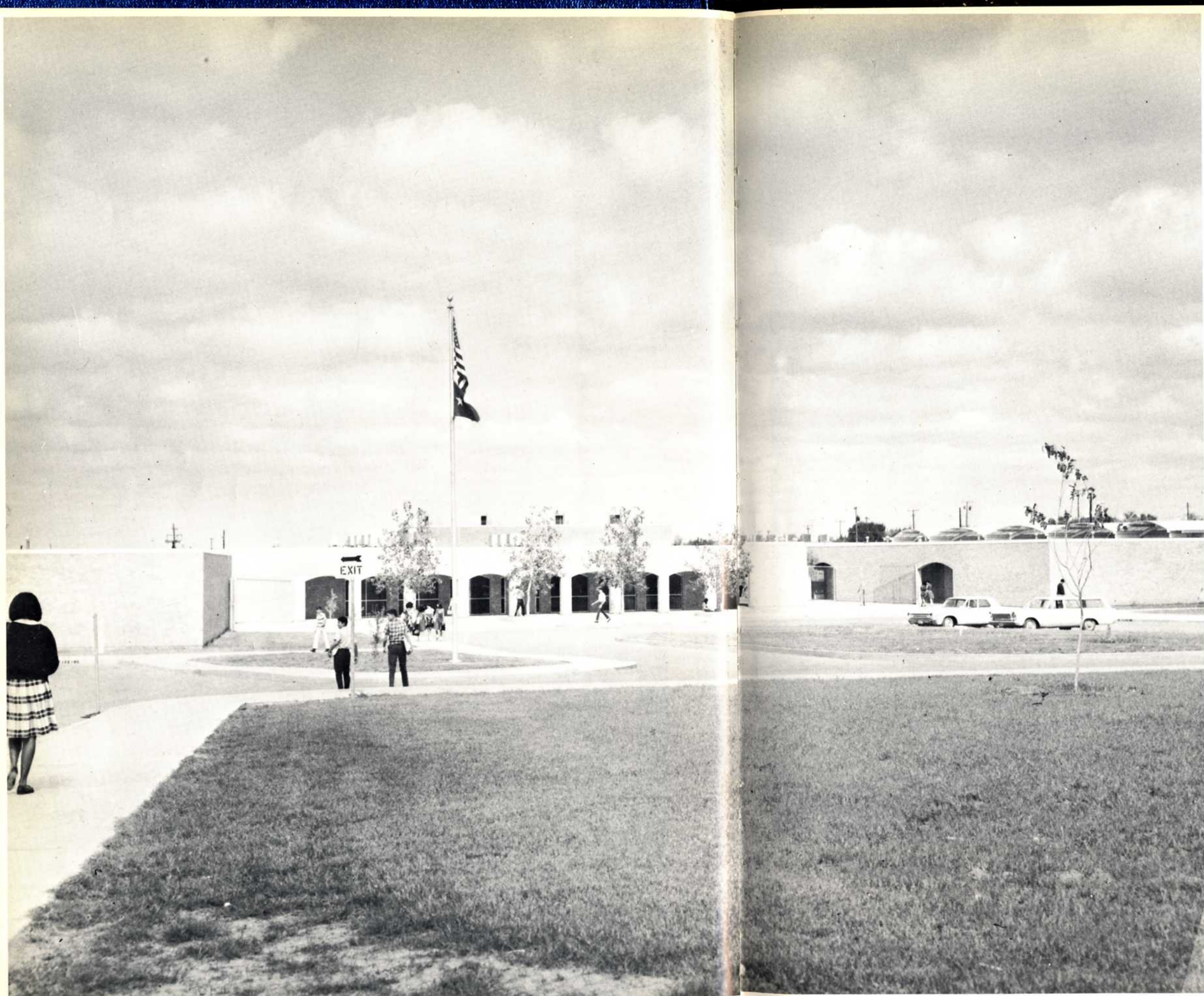

The school is indeed a great tribute to a great man—Superintendent J. W. Nixon.

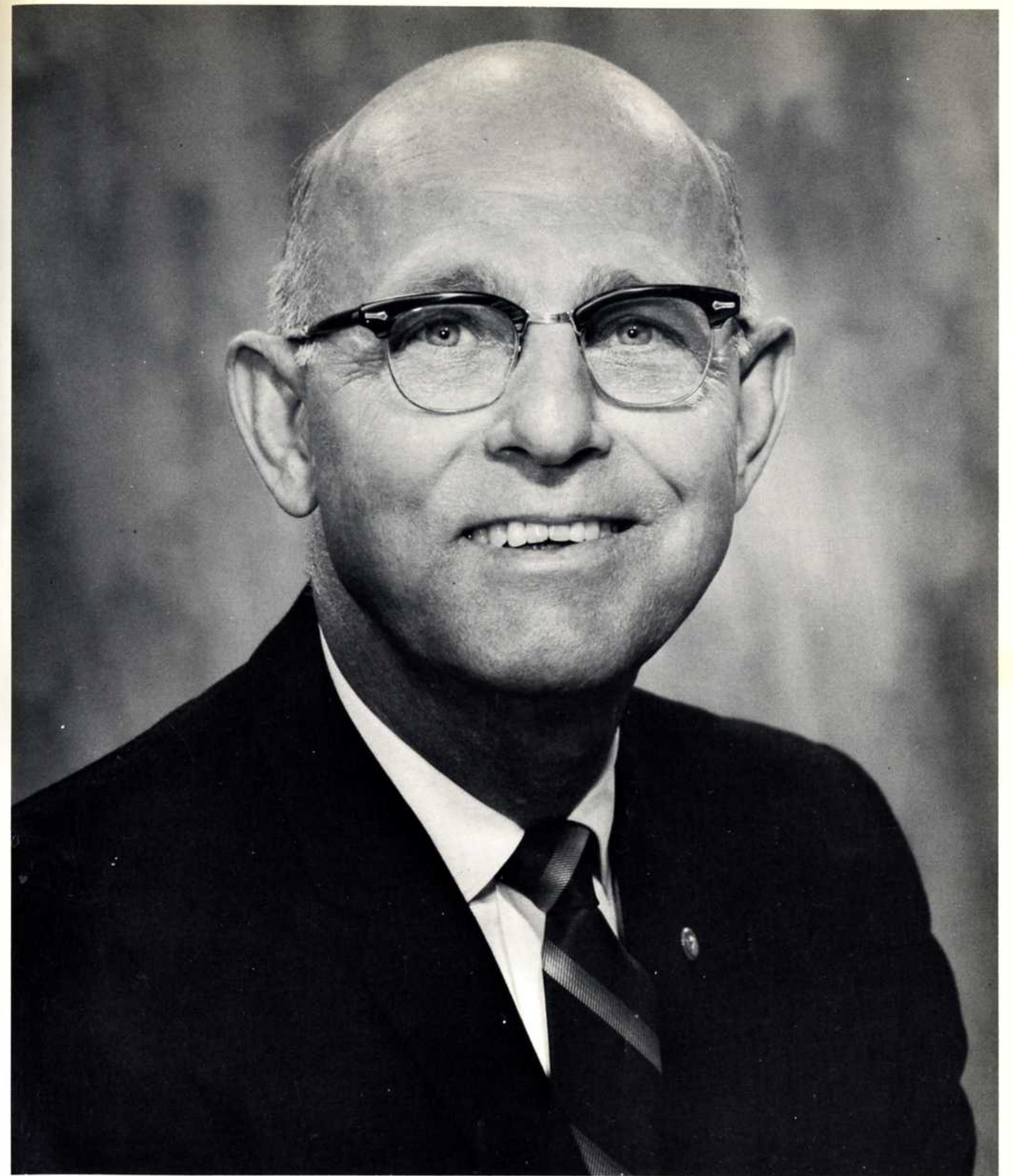

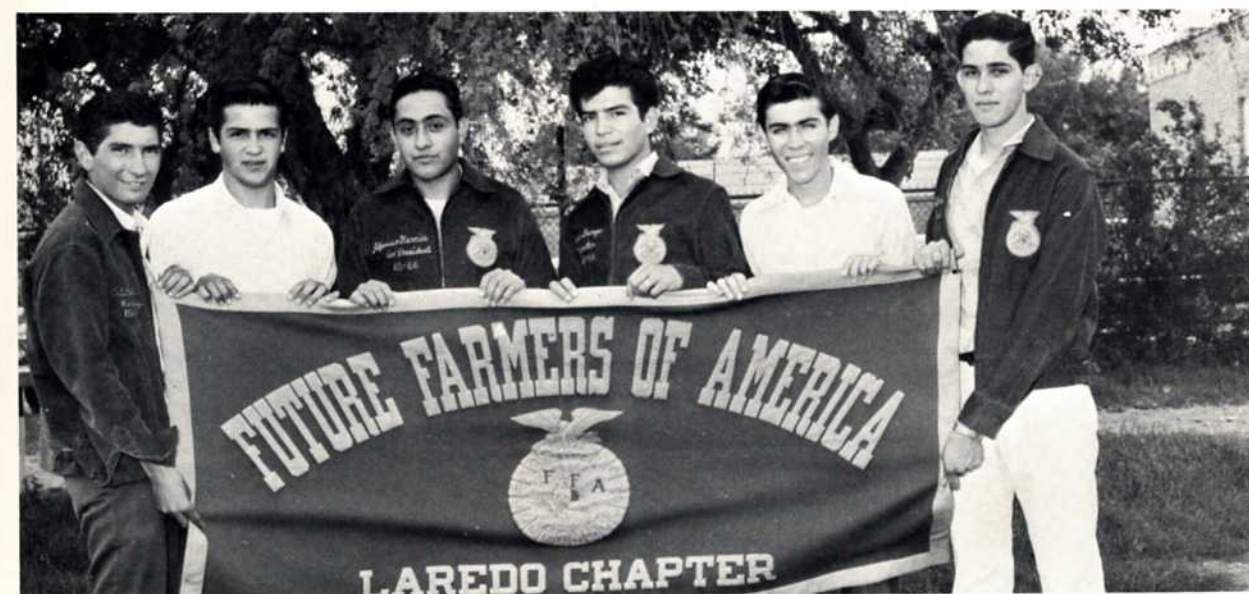

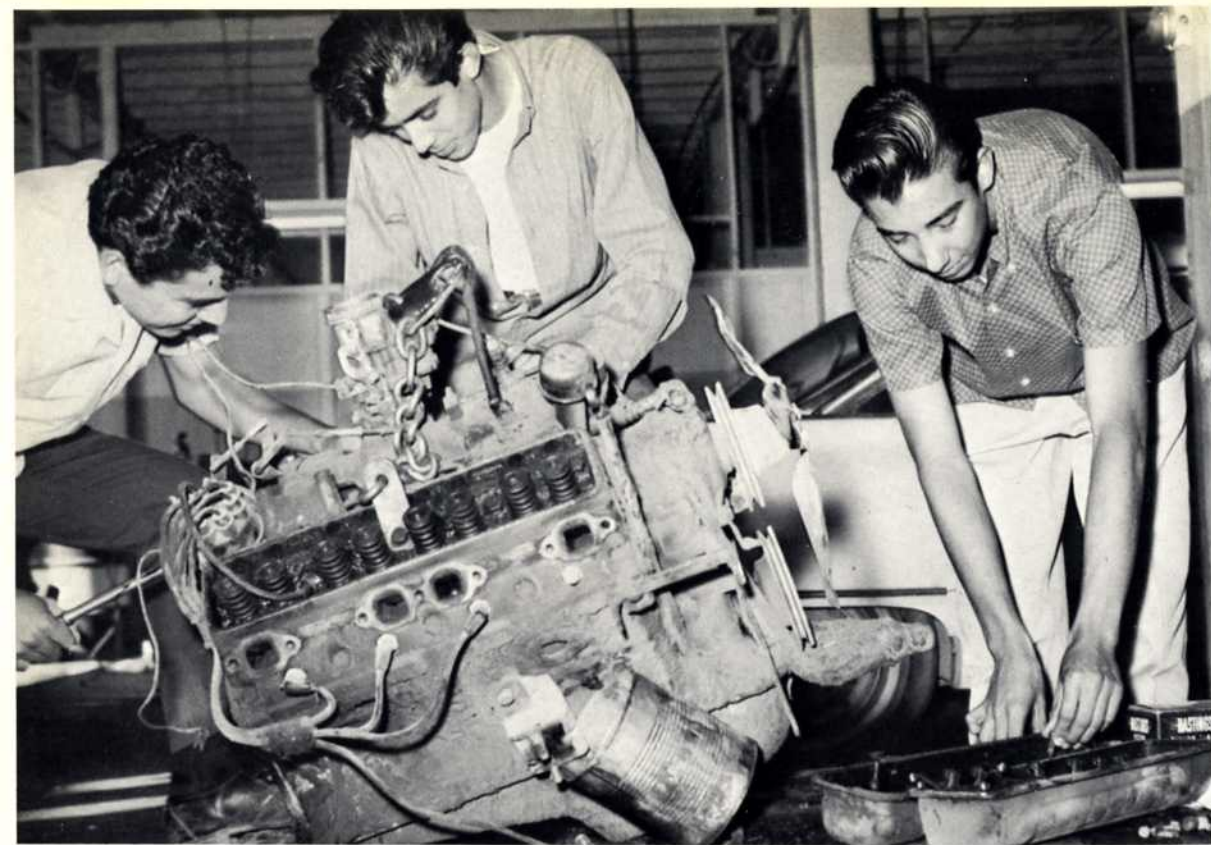

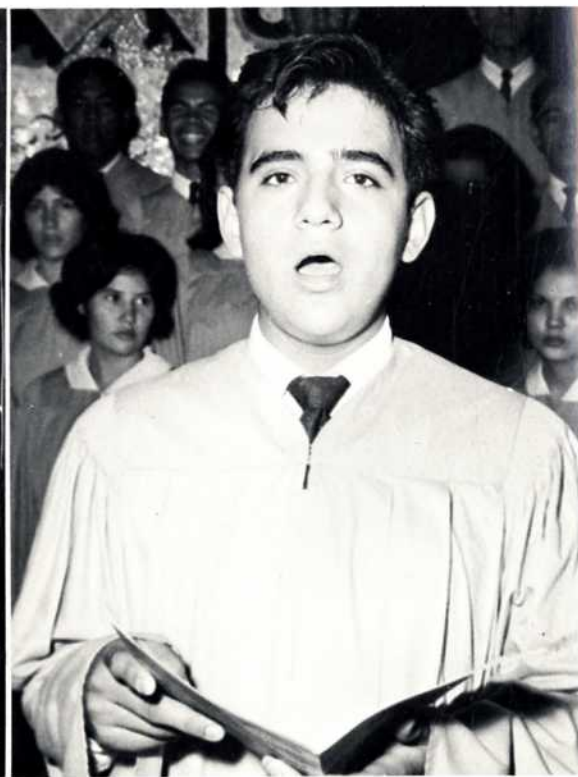

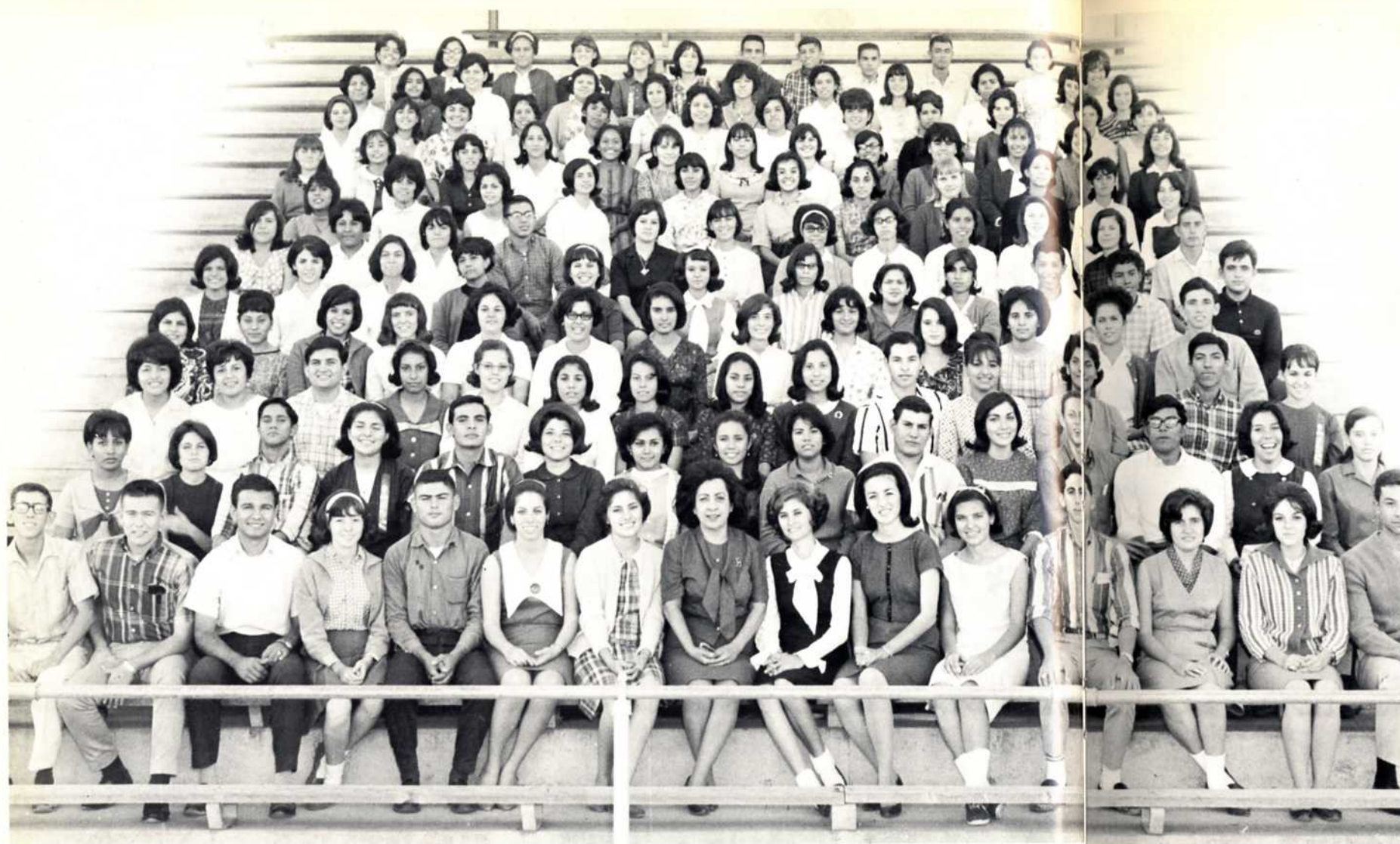

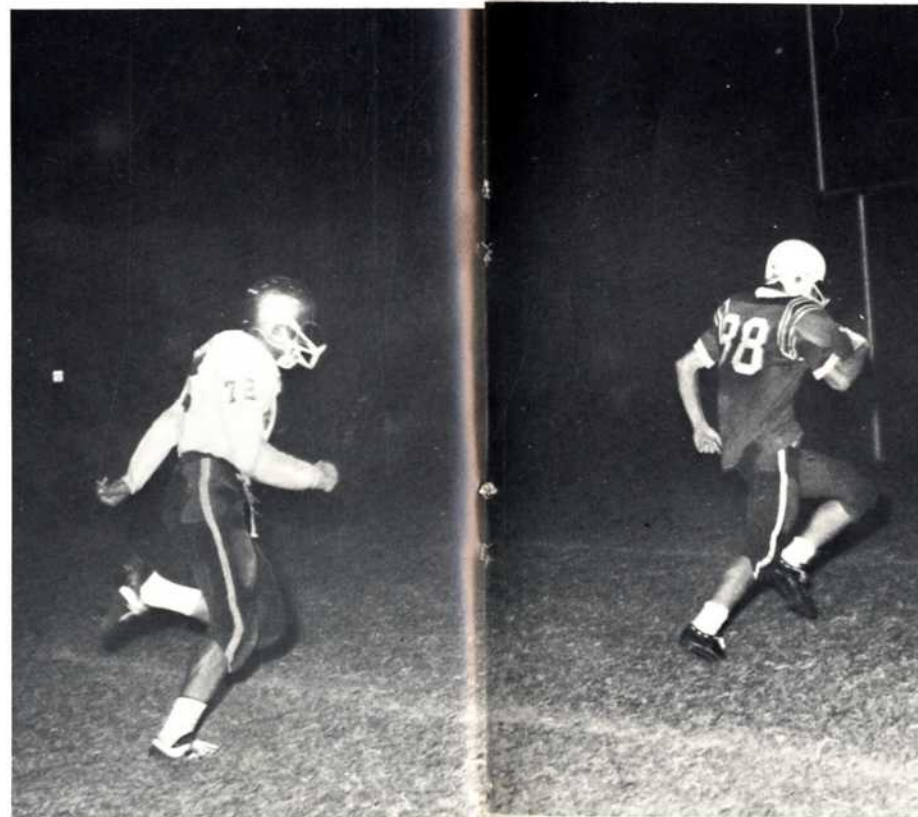

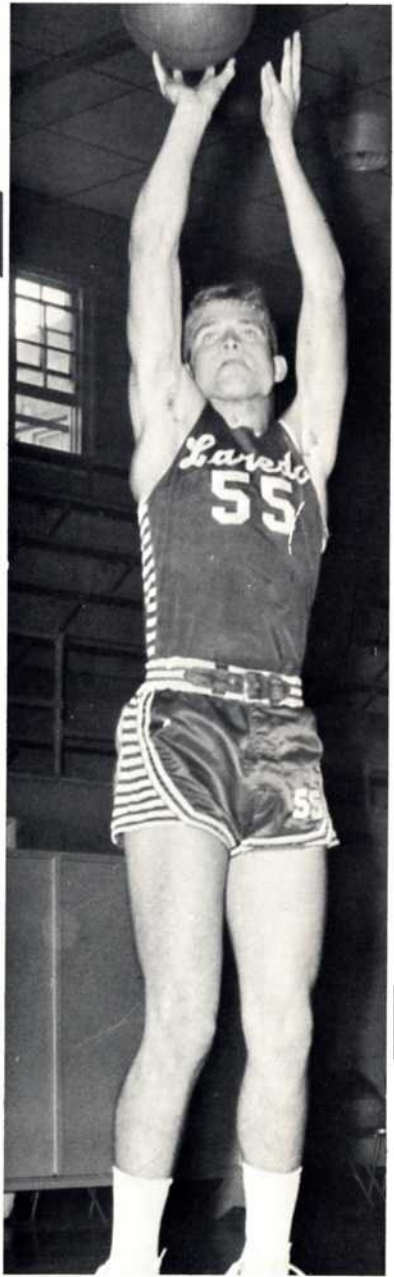

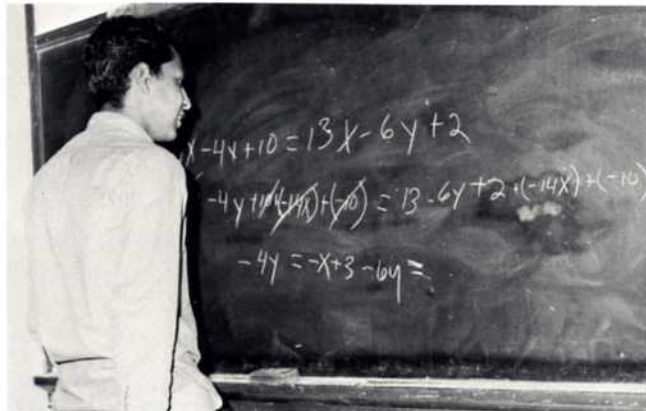

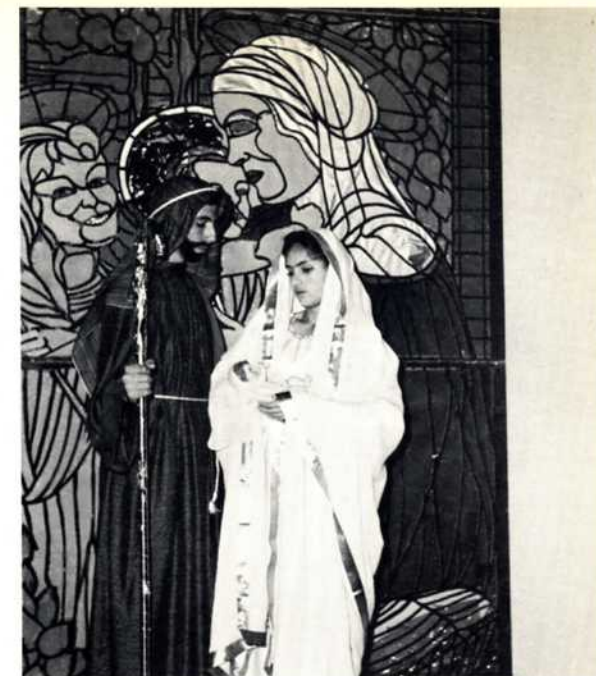

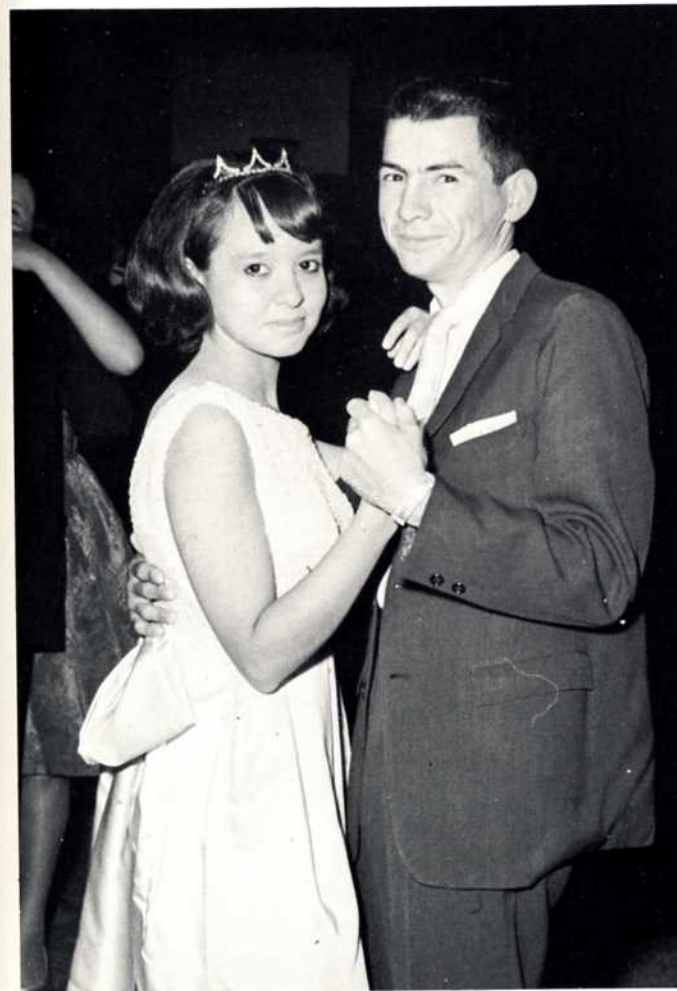
