DEDICATION

Upon hearing that Mrs. Kate Andrews had received the 1967 dedication to *La Pitahaya*, Mrs. Bessie Lindheim, former Martin High School English Department Chairman, wrote a note of congratulations to Mrs. Andrews. She closed with the statement that all she could add to the annual staff was what the Aunt Jemima commercial stated: "What took you so long?"

It does seem that anyone who has spent as many years in the service of Martin High School and its students would have received recognition at an earlier date, for she has been teaching at a Laredo high school since 1930 when she first taught English, and in the late forties she began to teach American history, a course she teaches at present.

In 1934 she helped organize the Courtesy Service Club, an honorary service club, and became its sponsor in 1943. She held this position until 1951.

At present, Mrs. Andrews is senior sponsor and is responsible for diplomas being in their correct order when given out at commencement. Her handwriting appears neatly on each diploma envelope—a task which she accomplishes on her own time. Besides giving so much of herself to the school and the students, any colleague in need of help can always turn to Mrs. Andrews with confidence. She is one individual who always finds a solution to even the most trying problem.

"Aunt Kate," as many of her former CSC members call her, is extremely thoughtful. During the Christmas holidays it was Mrs. Andrews who thought of bringing homemade packs of cupcakes for the janitors and their families. She must have spent many late evenings baking during the Christmas rush, but unselfishly giving of herself for the happiness of others is not an unusual characteristic in her. Faculty members who have young children will not be surprised to see Mrs. Andrews sent them an interesting fairy tale or children's book which she picked up at the grocery store.

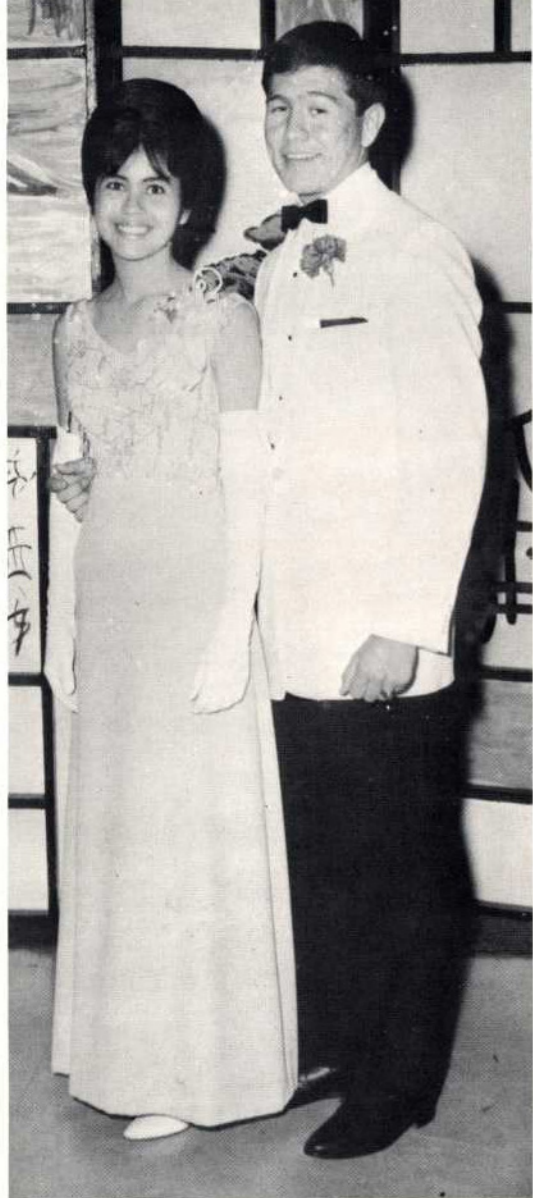

All good things end too soon, and with a nostalgic look, Amelia Gomez and Beto Mendoza seem to remember that prom time brings the school year to an end.

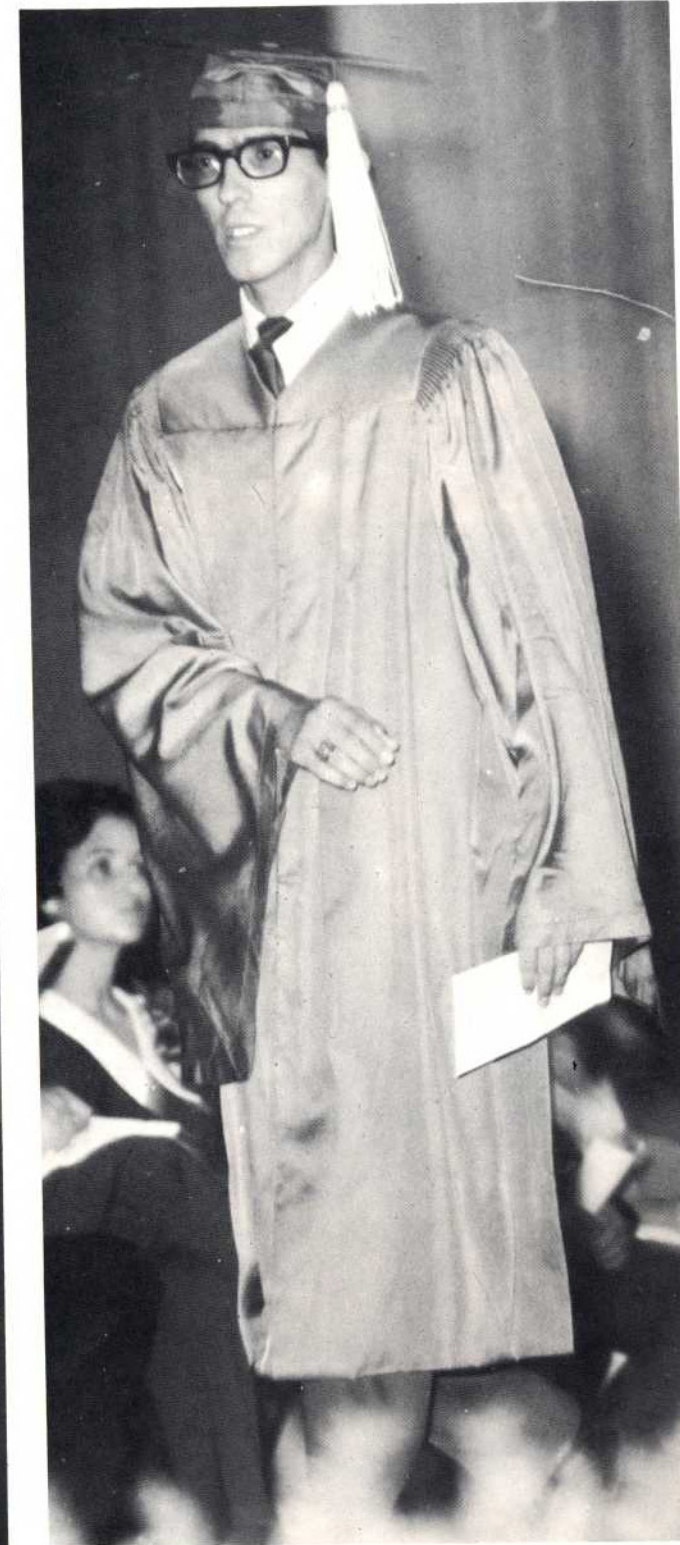

Smiling proudly, honor senior Bertha Gomez received her diploma from School Board Secretary Raymond Goodman.

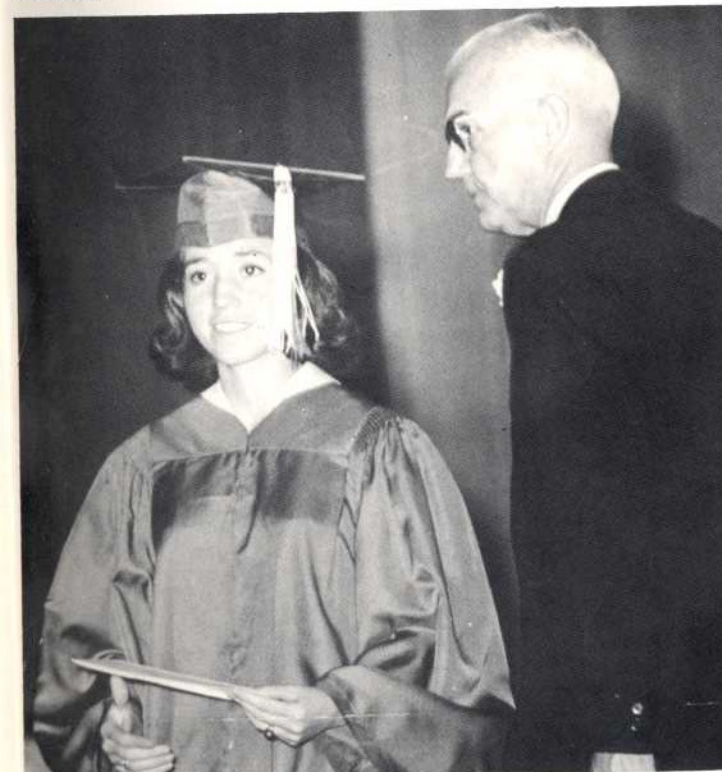

School leaders were officially installed after solemnly taking the Martin High School Oath of Office.



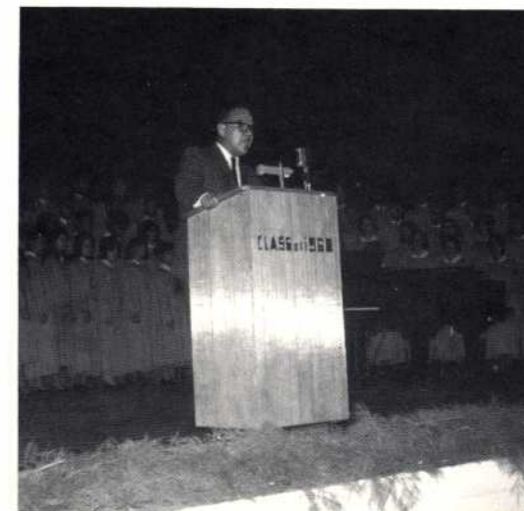
The ROTC Color Guard initiated the ceremonies which began Open House at Martin High School.

"I am happy to see you this morning," Principal Pena addressed the student body, faculty and guests during assembly.

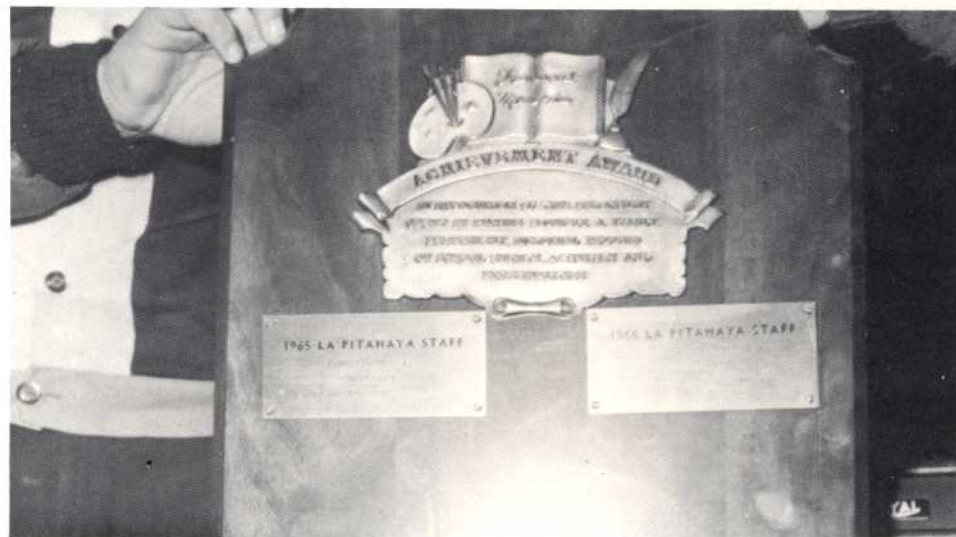

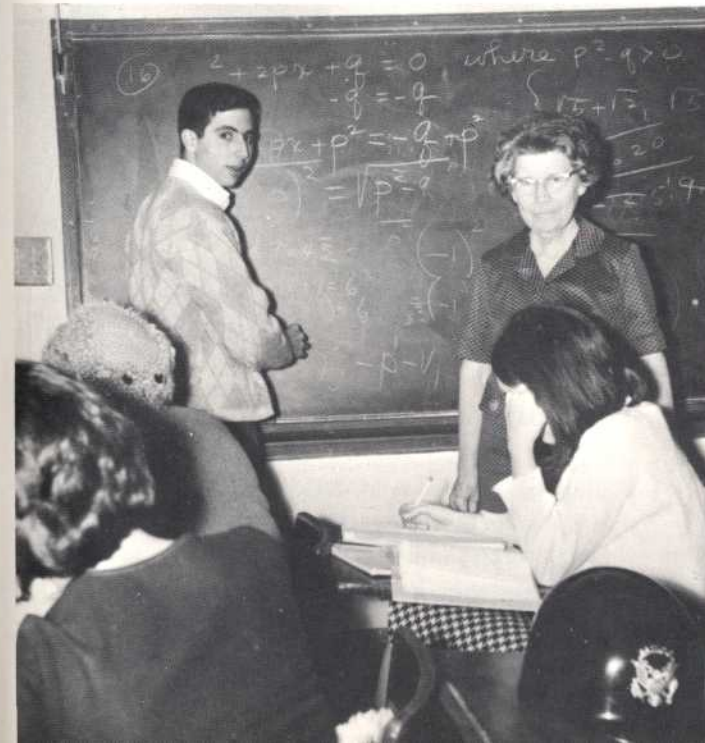

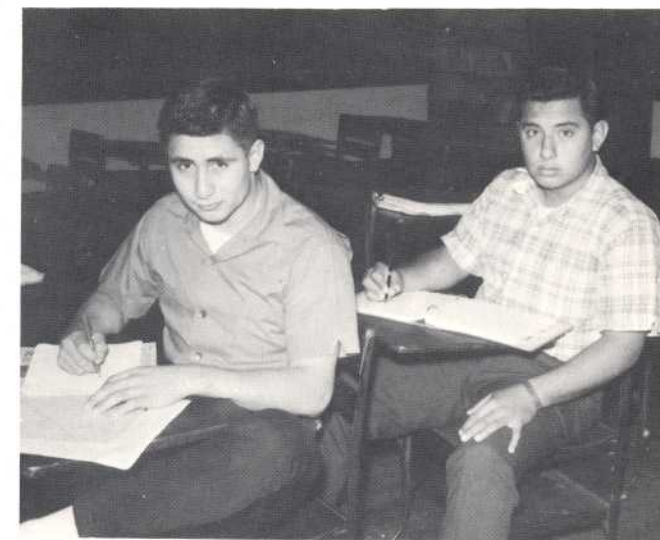

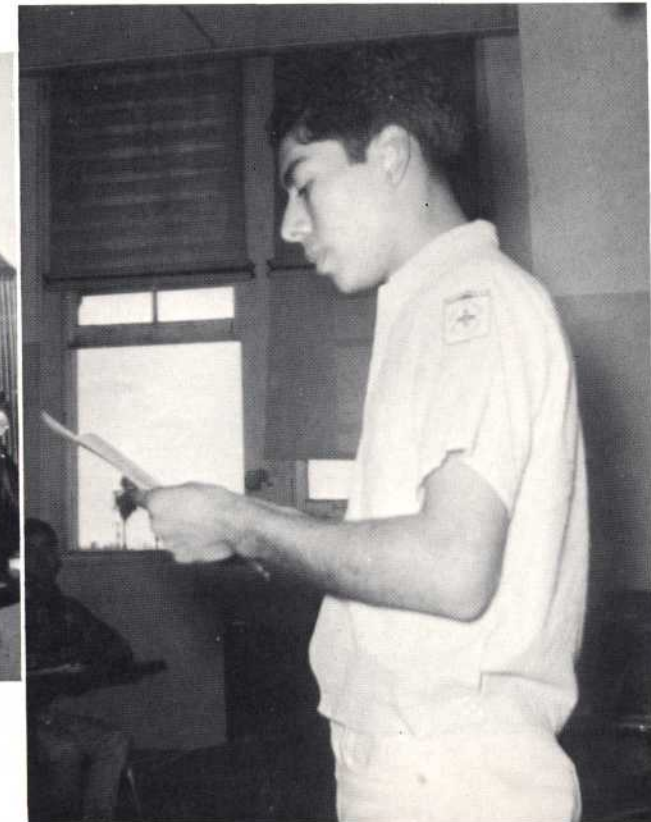

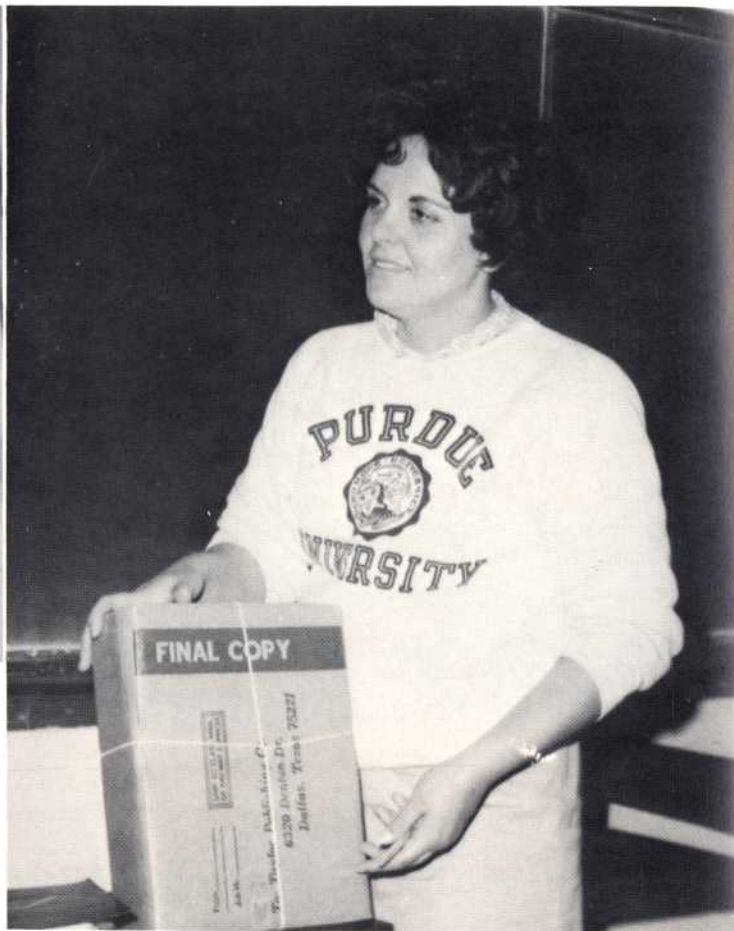

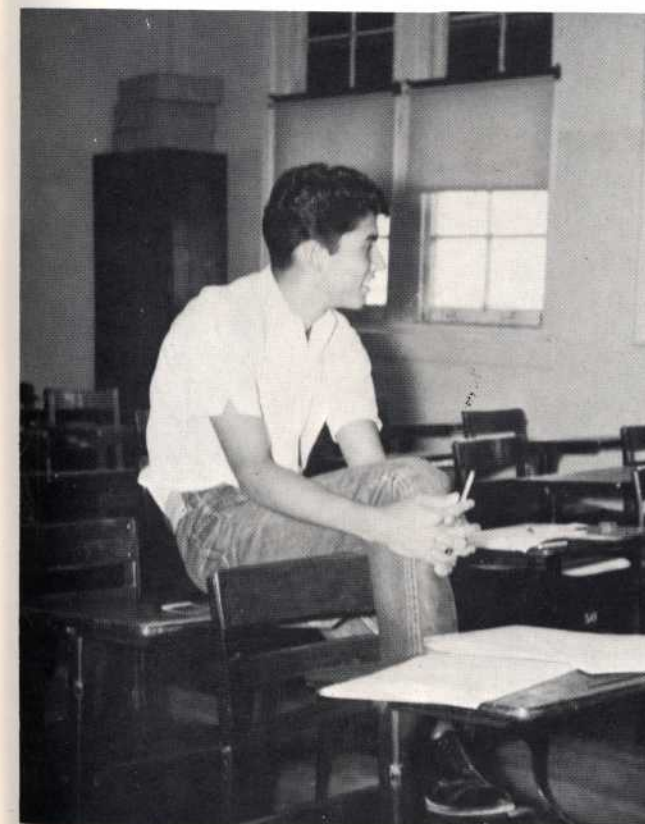

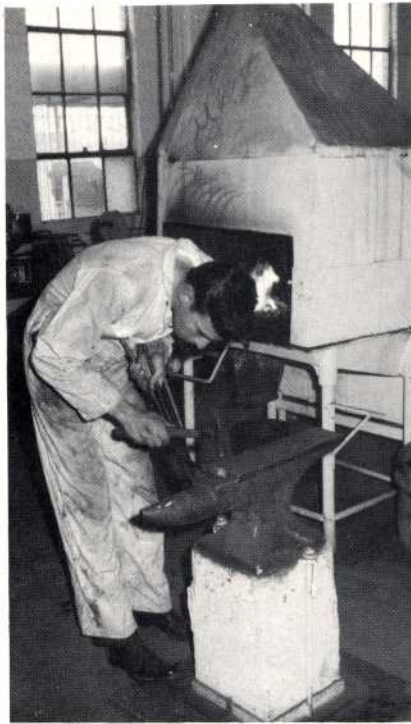

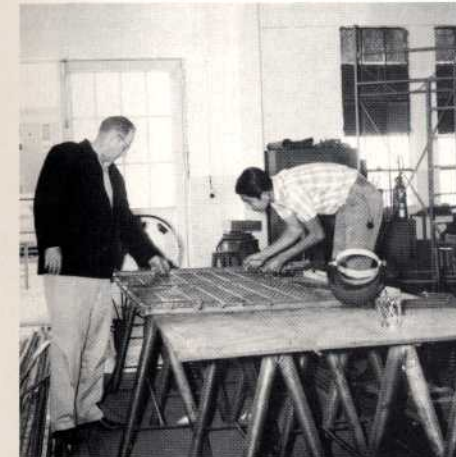

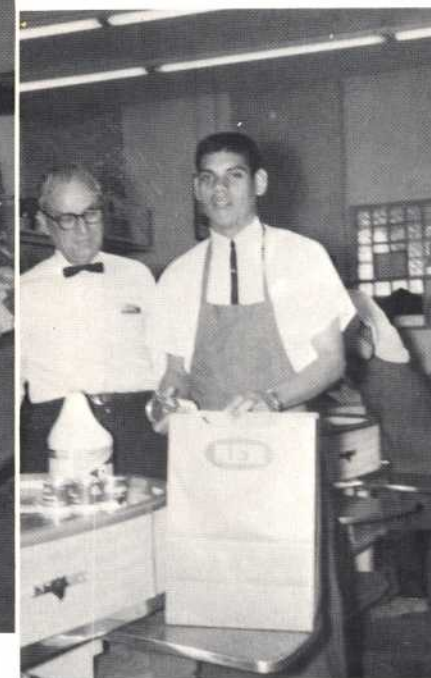

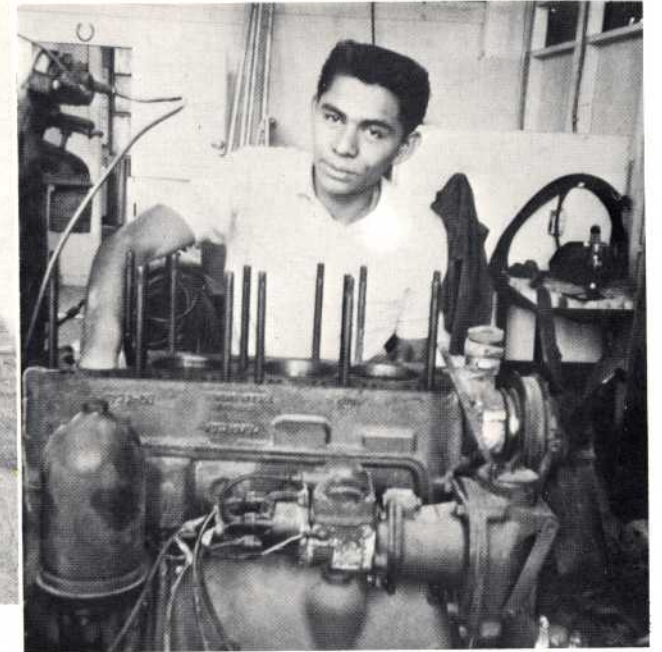

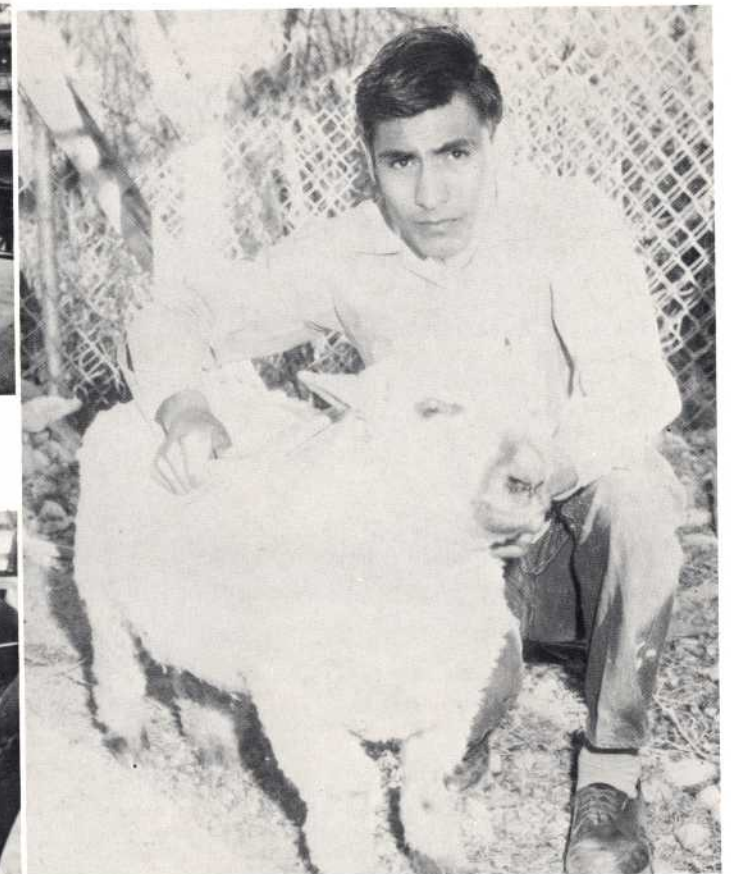

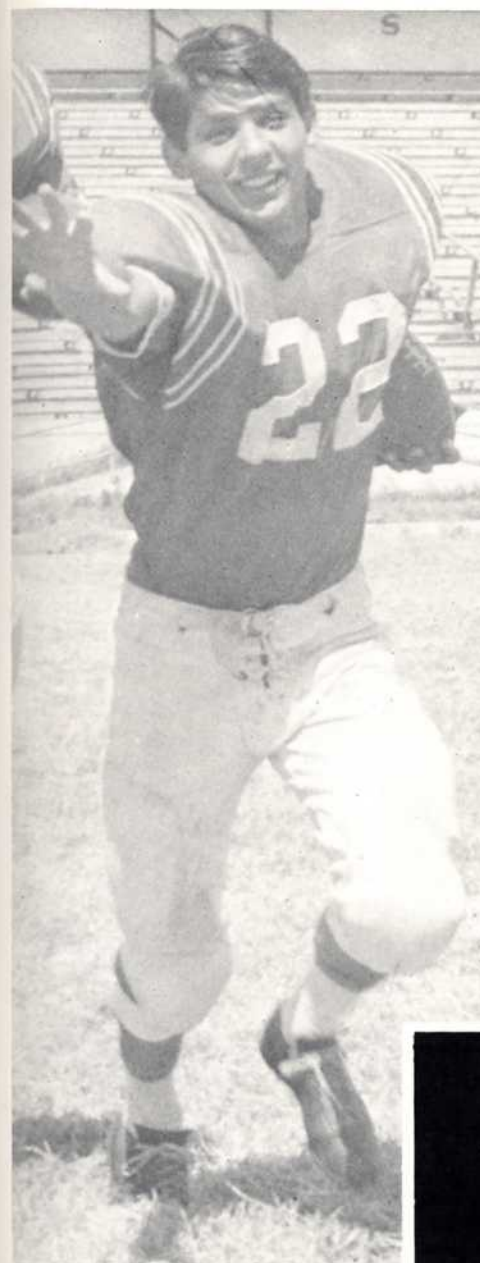

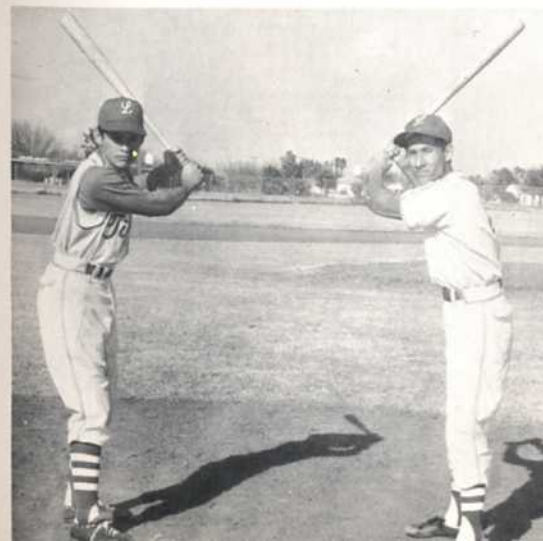

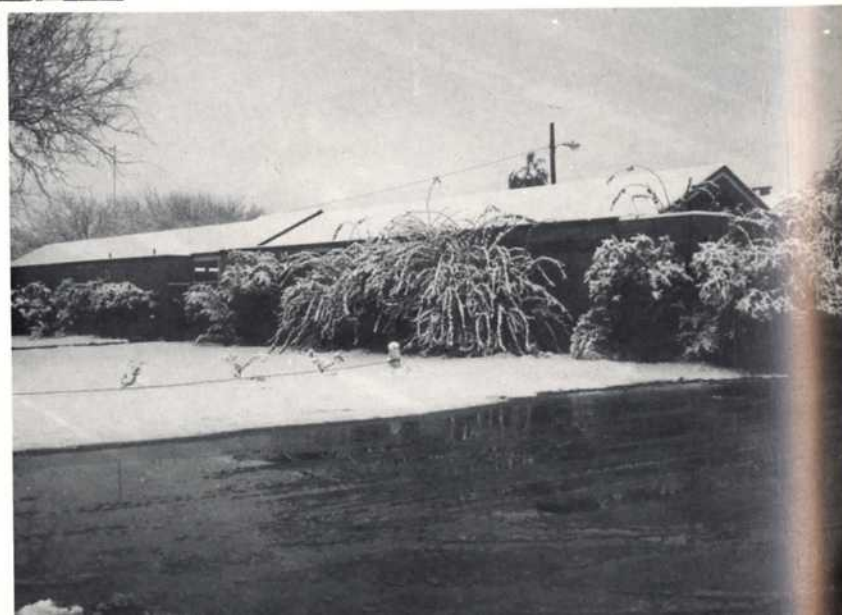

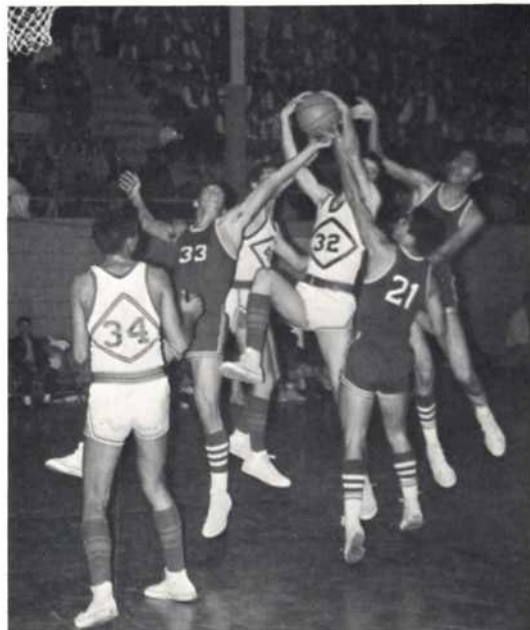

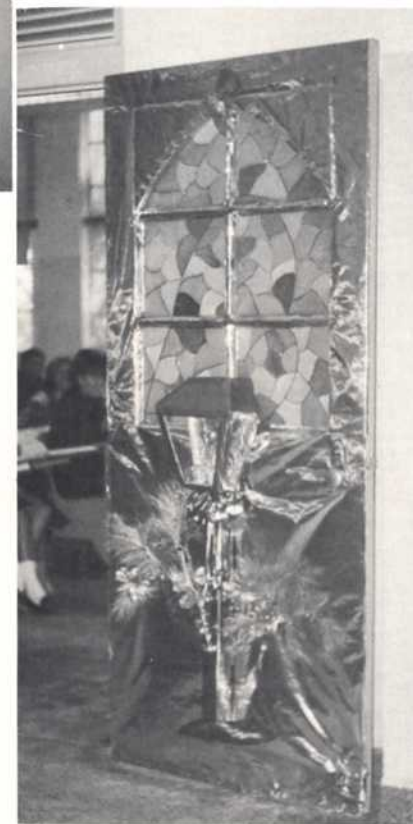
