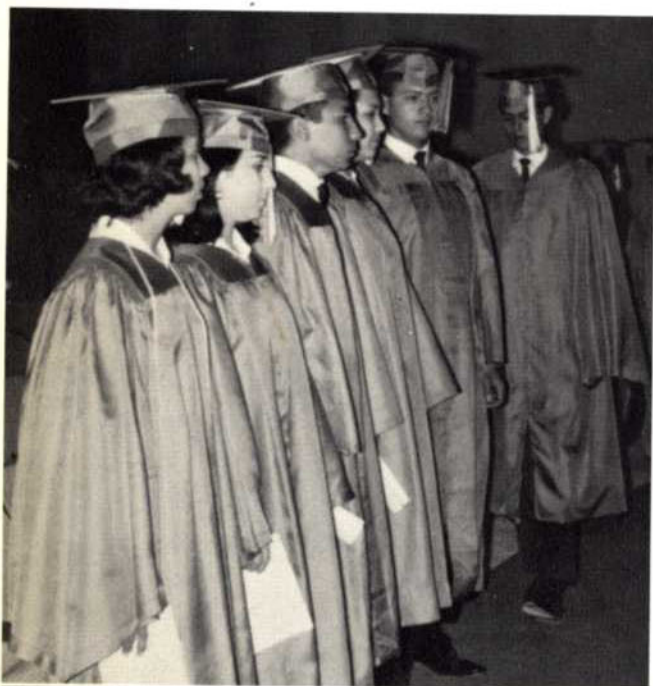

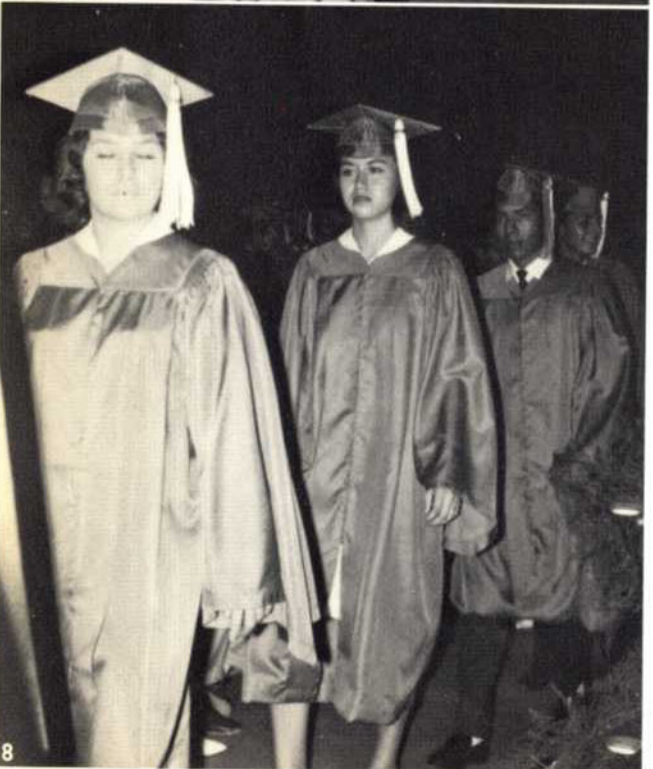

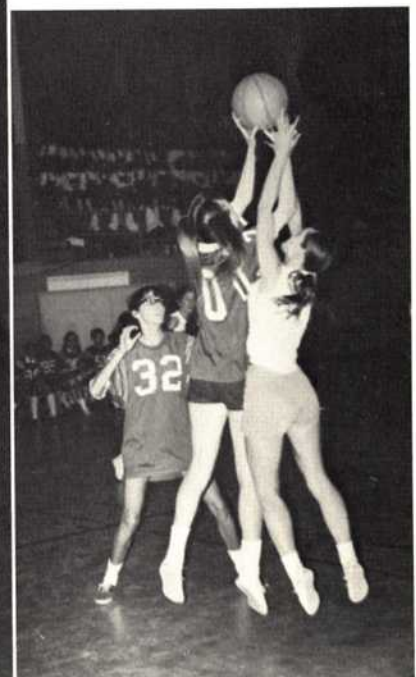

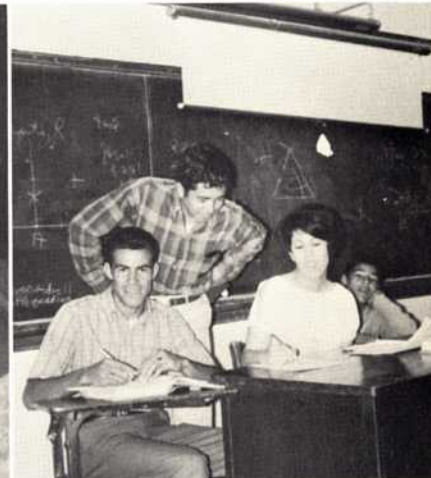


Mrs. Carole Wilson is the energetic and creative head sponsor of the Junior Class. She devotes a great deal of her time to raise funds and create class spirit.

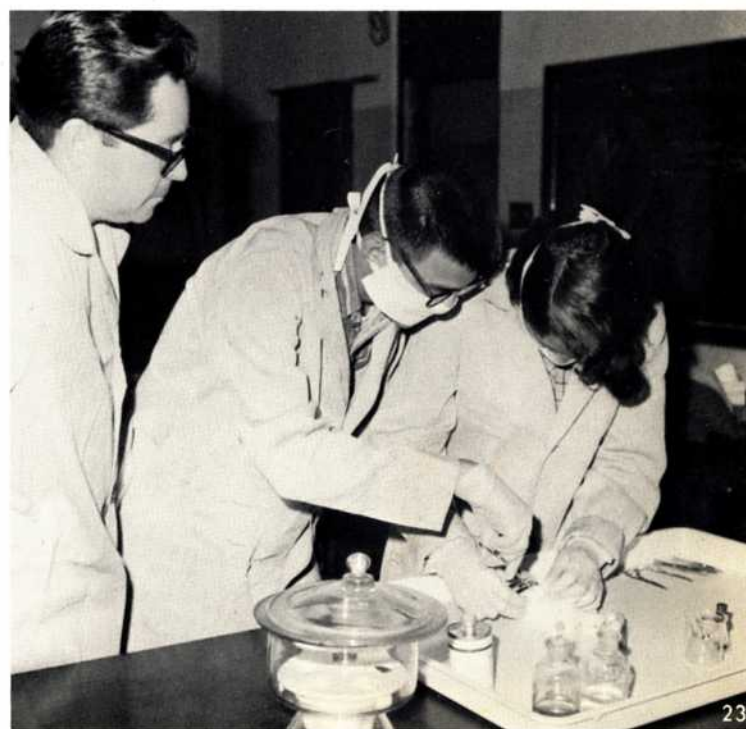

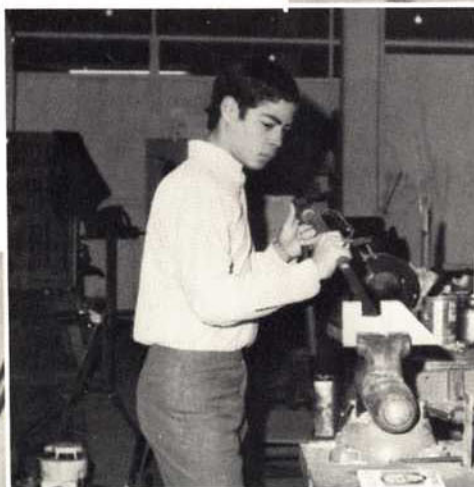

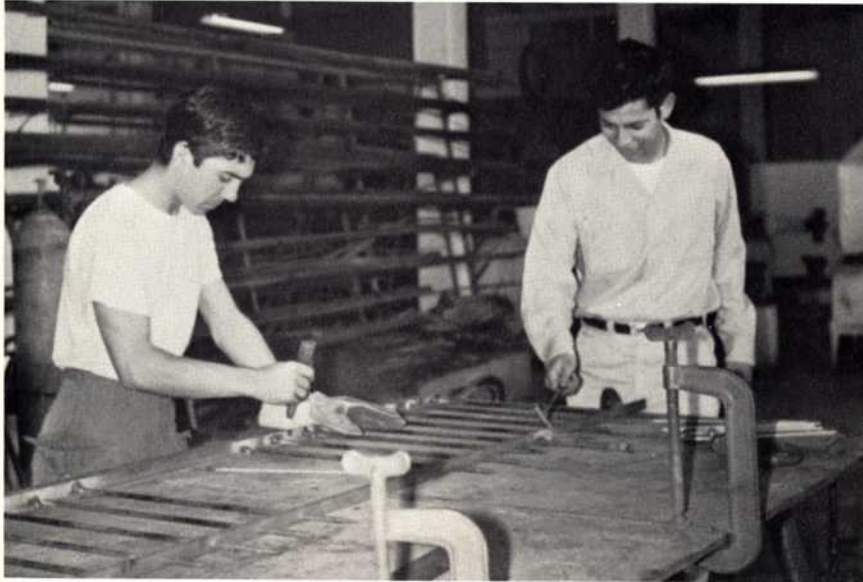

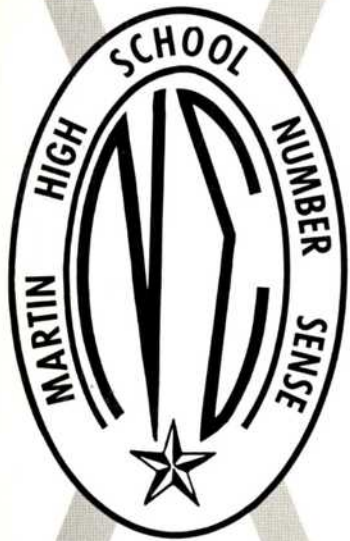

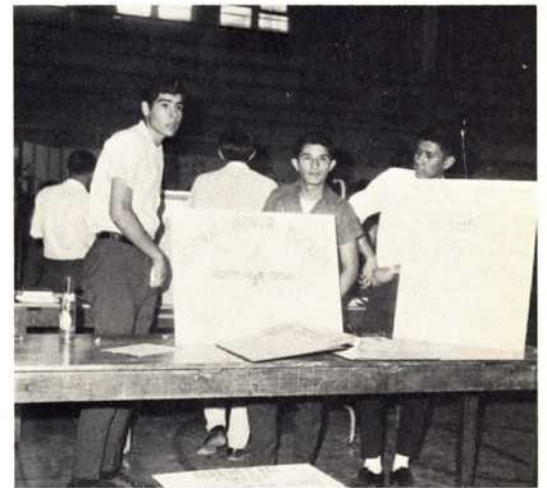

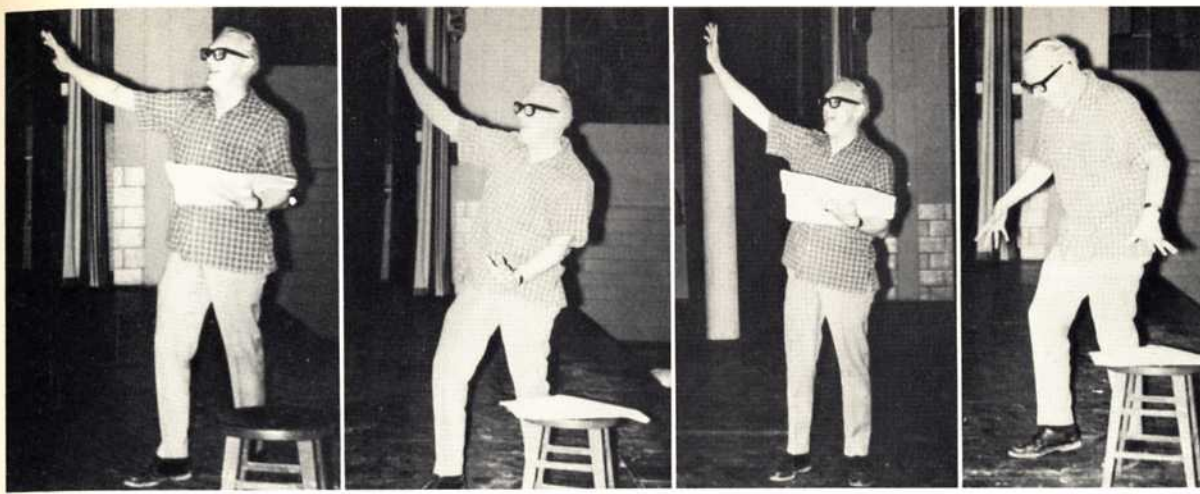

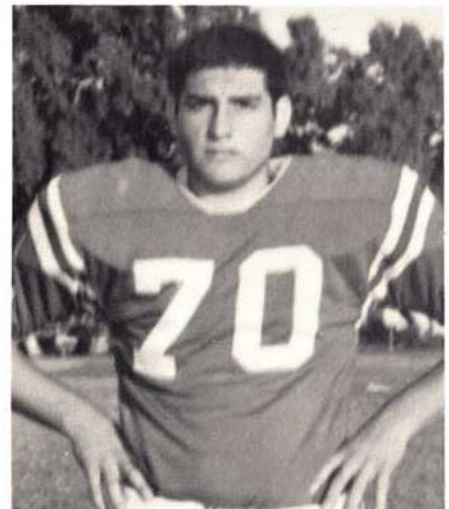
